Judges' Biographies

DIANE ADORNO-LEGRAND

FCI All Breed International Judge

Judge licensed thru the FEDERACION CANINA DE VENEZUELA (FCV), but under the guidelines of the FCI for she resides in a country which is a non FCI member, therefore, judging approvals for the FCI points must be requested from the Federation Cynologique Internacionale (FCI).

I began to venture into the world of Dog Shows in 1976 invited by my friend Rafael de Santiago, President of the FCPR, also of the FCI.



For many years I handled Boxers, Whippets, Salukis,

Pekingese, Italian Greyhound, Great Danes and owned and handled Smooth and Longhair Dachshunds, and other breeds including Afghan Hounds, acquiring my first Afghan hound which was bred by the late Sunny Shay, at that moment I realized my deep love for sight hounds. At the end of 1979 I met my first Saluki, who also belonged to Sunny Shay and there my love for this wonderful breed, did not acquire my first Saluki until 1991 from well-known Coppercrest kennels.

In the year 1996, I received my first invitation to judge and have done so in many countries including Australia, Canada, Colombia, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, México and others. In 2009 was invited to Canada to judge the Saluki National and the Bouvier des Flandres National, in 2010 to Australia to judge the Sydney Sighthound Specialty, Rhodesian Ridgeback Regional and again in 2018 for the Saluki Club of South Wales, breeds at the 4P's club and finals of the Sighthound Association Specialty.

With my partner Maria Elsa Pérez T., we started Shaman Salukis in 1993 since then we have bred many Venezuelan, International and American champions also some acquired championships from several other countries. From these 2 litters we had 1 Multi BIS champion with 7 titles including World'97 champion, Top Sighthound in Venezuela in 1996 and 1997 and 1999 and then his son was the BIS at the "Purina Ranking 2002" Judged by an FCI All Breed Judge out of the 49 top Venezuelan Dogs of that year.


In 2000 acquired my first Standard Smooth Dachshund from the famous Rose Farm's kennel, he went to earn BIS in many countries. I then acquired my Standard Longhair Dachshund also Rose Farm bred 2 beautiful girls, "Salt" finished by 15 months from the bred by class and was No.1 LH Dachshund for AKC BBOH 2012, "Sugar" won many BOB and Grp placements too, they were 2 multiple breed winners.

JANET & JOE LOBB

Dobenhaus Reg & FauxPaw Reg, Ontario, Canada





Now both retired, Janet enjoyed a 30-year career in Data Base administration for a Window and Door Manufacturer. Joe was involved in the Farm Equipment industry in Sales and Territory Management for over 45 years.



As far as Dog Show involvement, we are 'Life' members of the Canadian Kennel Club and belong to the 'Canadian Dog Judges Association'. We were founding members of the 'all breed' Bluewater Kennel Club which existed for over 35 years. We are currently members of the American Fox Terrier Club and very active members with the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada. We are past members of DPC Canada, Lake Effect Fox terrier Club NY and Black and Tan Coonhound Club of America.

We have limited our breeding and showing for many years now due to our judging. We try to attend major Dog Events and Specialties in the U.S.A. and Canada for education & observation purposes. We are also quite interested in All Livestock exhibitions and attend these events as much as possible.

Janet started judging (1996) a few years earlier than Joe and is CKC licensed for 'All Breeds'

Joe continued to show dogs for others for a couple more years due to some handling commitments, before jumping into the 'Judging ring' (2002) but is now also licensed to judge 'All Breeds".

As for dogs, we recently lost our elderly Smooth Fox Terrier and Black and Tan Coonhound and for the first time in 48 years we are living without a dog in our home. We are missing them terribly and hope to bring in a new household member if an opportunity arises.

Of note, one of our fox terriers and our first B&T coonhound were the 'top dogs' in Canada in their respective breeds in 2006, the only year they were shown to any degree. Our last SFT was Canada's Top Smooth Fox in 2013. All attained American Championships with some very nice wins along the way. Another point of interest, is that our first Coonhound is the only multi 'best in show' winning bitch in breed history in our country. Our last B&T coonhound male finished his Canadian title with two Best in Shows from the classes and obtained his Grand Championship in the USA with great success and multiple groups and RBIS along the way.

We started "in dogs" in 1974 with a Doberman dog of show quality. Our first litter was whelped in 1977 under the 'Dobenhaus' prefix. We were always a small kennel breeding only one litter per year. There have been many champions along the way from all litters, with many highlights. These include, group winners, best in show puppy awards, several "awards of merit" at national specialties, best of winners at the Canadian national and "best in show" at the Doberman Pinscher club of Canada National Specialty in 1991. All of these dogs were breeder/owner handled. We also bred and owned the top producing female in Canada in 1990, with 7 champions finished that year, which in turn tied us with Wrath-Liberator Kennel for Pedigree Pal Breeders of the year for Dobermans in Canada. In the late 1990's we were also co-breeders of Canada's Top Doberman.

In 1988 we added the smooth fox terrier breed under the" FauxPaw" prefix to our kennel. We started with a Ch.Tarb the Brat granddaughter, who gave us multiple Canadian and American

champions in her two litters. We have had Canada's 'top smooth' on several occasions, and dogs that were either owned or bred by us have won the Canadian National Specialty three times. A particular win of note would be AOM at the American National (Montgomery) in an entry of one hundred and sixty-seven. Also, Pedigree Pal Top Breeder in Canada award in 1997.

Over the years we have had many excellent dogs of other breeds in our household and in our charge, some of which we owned and some we handled for other breeders and owners.

We handled professionally, (Joe primary and Janet more as assistant and backup) for twenty-five years. This consisted of some of Canada's top or top ranked dogs Handled breeds of note were Dobermans, Bernese Mtn dogs, Boxers, Australian cattle dogs, German Shepherd, Bouvier, Collies, Smooth fox terriers, Wheatens, Pugs, Chins, Setters, Springers, Goldens, Labs, Greyhounds, B&T Coonhound. We also owned, exhibited, and are involved with the German Shepherd breed and handled at many Specialty events in the earlier years.

Handling highlights would include winning All Breed BIS and Specialty BIS (incl National events) with many of the above-mentioned breeds. Joe piloted a Canadian bred Bernese Mtn. Dog to Best in Show at the American National Specialty as well.

To date we have judged in Canada, USA, Australia, Bermuda, China, Mexico, Colombia, Argentina, Japan, Slovenia, Finland, Ireland, New Zealand, Sweden, Peru, Chile, South Africa and Wales. We've been honoured to have awarded "BIS" in many of these countries.

Assignments have included many 'Specialty' events...including national/regional/chapter club shows for Dobermans, Bernese Mtn Dogs, Alaskan Malamute, Siberians, Rottweilers, Boxers, Aust Cattle Dogs, German Shepherd, Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, English Setters, Vizslas, Labradors, Weimaraners, Borzoi, Basenji, Newfoundlands, Eng Toy spaniel. We have also both enjoyed judging "Rare Breed" Shows in Canada in past years as this has exposed us to many other well-known breeds from around the world.

We've been honoured to have officiated at "Special" events including Canada's "Show of Shows" (Joe and Janet-2009) and the "Atlantic Top Dog Awards" (Janet-2010 & 2012)

We judged the 50th anniversary Specialty of the New Zealand Dominion Doberman Club in 2017.

We were asked to create and present a seminar on Dobermans for judges In Japan in 2014 with a record attendance at that point. This same seminar info was requested by the Kennel Club of Peru.

We were honoured to be asked to assist with the mentoring of AKC Judges at the DPC of America National in the Chicago area in 2018.

In 2022 we were very honoured to go to Wales and judge the Golden Anniversary Championship Show (50th) for the Welsh Doberman Club. Joe - Dogs Janet - Bitches. Best of Breed was decided between the two of us, and no easy feat, as both sexes were excellent.

Both of us have also judged multiple Specialties and are well known in the Bernese Mtn Dog and German Shepherd World. Obviously, many of the Terrier breeds have also been of keen interest for us, and we've been fortunate to have had some great assignments involving them.

Specialty assignments are taken very seriously, as we fully understand the impact our evaluations and ultimate decisions may have on the breed.

Officiating around the world has allowed us the opportunity to judge most breeds, and it is very interesting noting the similarities and differences encountered in many different countries outside of Canada and USA.. It's also great to experience many breeds that we don't have here in North America. All assignments have been very rewarding and enlightening and continue to provide broader knowledge and experiences with all breeds.

MICHELLE SCOTT



Michelle has been involved with purebred dogs her whole life. She grew up with Irish Setters.

She has bred and owned Akitas, Maltese, Lakeland Terriers, all three varieties of Poodles, and now Brussels Griffons and a Dandie Dinmont Terrier.

Michelle was a professional handler until 1998 when she retired and began her judging career.

She is now approved as an all-breed judge and has judged in Canada, the US, Denmark, Colombia, Argentina, Australia, Mexico, the Philippines, China, and Japan.

PETER SCOTT

Peter started breeding Maltese in the 1970s.

This eventually led to a career as a professional handler that spanned some 40 years.

He has, along with his wife Michelle, also bred Lakeland Terriers, Poodles, and most recently Dandie Dinmont Terriers.

Peter retired from handling several years ago and is now a CKC licensed judge for Groups 4, 6, and half of 5, and on permit for the other half of 5.





DR. RONALD I. SPRITZER

I started in purebred dogs in 1968 with the purchase of my first Borzoi.

I bred and exhibited many Borzois and Long-Haired Dachshund to their Championships. I also owned and showed whippets, a Scottish Deerhound, a Greyhound, and a Saluki.

I started judging in 1982 and am now licensed to judge hounds, sporting, working and most non-sporting breeds.

JUDITH SHURB

My passion for dogs began with Afghan Hounds, where I had the privilege of breeding multiple group winners and outstanding show dogs. From a young age, I was surrounded by different breeds, including Boston Terriers and Miniature Pinschers. Later, I owned French Bulldogs and both smooth and long-coated Chihuahuas.

My heart truly fell in love with the Havanese, in the late 1990s. This is the breed where I achieved remarkable success, winning multiple Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show titles. While I wasn't a large-scale breeder, every puppy I produced went on to finish their Championship title and group win or place in prestigious competitions.



My dedication to the dog fancy extends beyond breeding, as I've had the honor of judging in the USA, Canada, South America, and Australia.

Above all, I'm driven by a deep love for animals and my family.

BELINDA CHANTELLE THOMAS

I have been involved in the 'Dog World' since the age of eight.

During my early years, I handled numerous breeds including Afghan Hounds, Finnish Lapphund and Siberian Huskies and was involved in the breeding of Tibetan Spaniels under my family's 'Kyambel' prefix.

Currently, alongside my husband, I own and breed Australian Shepherds under our 'Ochaye' prefix. To date, we have produced 20 Champions and titled 6



Supreme Champions – 3 of which bare our 'Ochaye' prefix. Our homebred male still holds the record of being Australia's youngest Supreme Champion Australian Shepherd at 18 months of age. In 2019, we exhibited the No.1 ranked Australian Shepherd and No.3 dog (All Breeds) in Australia: 'Aust Sup Ch Am/HK Gr Ch Impacts Pop Rocks' who achieved 30 x Best in Show awards in just over a year of showing. In the same year, I also handled 'Rock' to his Best Exhibit in Show win at the prestigious Sydney Royal Easter Show. In 2021, we then campaigned Teddy – 'Aust Sup Ch Am Ch Impacts Teddy Ruxpin (Imp USA)' – who became Australia's No.1 dog (All Breeds) in 2021.

Aside from showing and breeding, I have held the position of Secretary of the Collie Rough & Smooth Club of Queensland and Treasurer of the Gundogs & Heavy Breeds Club of Queensland. I am a Committee Member of the Australian Shepherd Club of Queensland and the Yuggera Canine Club (which hosts one of our State's largest annual All Breeds Cluster Show weekends). I have also served numerous times on the Committee of Queensland's "Dog of the Year".

In 2017, I passed my Judge's training entrance exam and later attained my first ANKC Championship Show group in 2020. I am now licensed in the Toy (Group 1), Hound (Group 4) and Working (Group 5) groups.

I have adjudicated at many Specialty Club Shows, including Cattle Dogs, Collie Rough and Smooths, Border Collies, Australian Shepherds, German Shepherds, Afghan Hounds and Chihuahuas, as well as at the Hound Club Specialty in 2023.

I have judged in Australia, New Zealand, Norway and America. In 2023, I was honoured to Judge at the Orlando Cluster (USA), as well as Best in Show at the Australian Shepherd Club of Central Florida.

Apart from my interests within the Dog World, I completed my University degree in Occupational Health and Safety and Human Resource Management at the Central Queensland Uni (CQU) and now work as part of the HR team in Queensland Health.

TIMOTHY DAVID GRAHAM THOMAS

I have been involved in the 'Dog World' since the age of six.

During my early years, I handled numerous Collie Roughs under the family prefix of 'Ochaye'. I have also shown and handled many other herding breeds as well as various toy breeds – most significantly the Chinese Crested.

My family and I titled 20 Collie Rough exhibits, in all three colours; including 15 which bear our 'Ochaye' prefix and 3 which became dual (New Zealand/Australian) Champions.

In both Australia and New Zealand, our Collie Roughs were awarded #1 placing in the National Breed Pointscores. Our most well-known Collie Roughs, 'GrCh Ochaye My Blue Heaven' and his son 'Gr/SupCh Ochaye Empire Builder', were (consecutively) Australia's leading Collie Roughs from 2000-2007. GrCh Ochaye My Blue Heaven still holds the breed record for being Australia's most consistent winning Collie Rough of all time - taking over 100 Group 1st awards. He also achieved 27 x BIS.

From 2010-2014, I co-owned and campaigned Australia's youngest Shiba Inu Grand and Supreme Champion: 'SupCh Orienta The Benedict'. 'Maverick' amassed 15 x BIS awards in his career which we believe ranks him amongst the greatest winning Shiba Inus in breed history.



Currently, I own and breed Australian Shepherds under my family 'Ochaye' prefix. To date, we have produced 20 Champions and titled 6 Supreme Champions – 3 of which bare our 'Ochaye' prefix. Our homebred male still holds the record of being Australia's youngest Supreme Champion Australian Shepherd at 18 months of age. Alongside my wife, we exhibited the No.1 ranked Australian Shepherd and No.3 dog (All Breeds) in Australia in 2019: 'Aust Sup Ch Am/HK Gr Ch Impacts Pop Rocks' who achieved 30 x Best in Show awards in just over a year of showing in Australia. 'Rock' also won Best Exhibit in Show at the prestigious 2019 Sydney Royal Easter Show. In 2021, we then campaigned Teddy – 'Aust Sup Ch Am Ch Impacts Teddy Ruxpin (Imp USA)' – who became Australia's No.1 dog (All Breeds) in 2021.

Aside from showing and breeding, I have held the position of Vice President for the Collie R&S Club of Qld Inc (2003/2004) and was the Club's Secretary from 2004 to 2009. I became President in 2009 and retired from that position in 2019. Finally, in 2022, I was honoured to be awarded "Life Membership" of the Qld Collie Club. In 2019, I was elected as President of the Australian Shepherd Dog Club of Queensland. I have also been the Vice President and Secretary of the Chinese Crested Dog Club of Qld and am a founding member of the Toy Dog Club of North Queensland.

In 2013, I was appointed to the position of "Chairperson" of Queensland's Dog of the Year. In February 2015, I was democratically elected (for a 4-year term) to the Dogs Queensland Board of Directors. From 2019 to 2021, I was appointed to the Conformation Judge's Committee.

In August 2015, I passed my final Judging exam, attainting ANKC All Breeds status and in 2018 I was officially recognised as an FCI International All Breeds Judge.

I have adjudicated at many Specialty Club Shows, including Rough and Smooth Collies, Australian Shepherds, Belgian Shepherds, German Shepherds, Shetland Sheepdogs and White Swiss Shepherds, as well as Cavalier King Charles Spaniels, Australian Silky Terriers, Pomeranians (National Show), the Asian Toy Breeds' Specialty and the Inaugural Chinese Crested Dog Club Show.

Besides judging extensively throughout Australia and New Zealand, I have had the honour of judging in over 30 countries around the World. My most notable judging assignments to date include the World Dog Show in Russia (2016), the World Dog Show in Amsterdam (2018), judging BIS at the Grand Rivers/Ashtabula Kennel Club (2018, USA), the Herding Group twice at the Orlando Cluster (in 2019 & 2023 USA) and Victoria's 2023 Dog of the Year Competition. I was also invited to Judge at the European Dog Show in Slovenia (2020) and the World Dog Show in Madrid (2020). However, the Covid pandemic had other plans.

Apart from my interests within the Dog World, I have completed two University degrees (from the University of Queensland); one in Law and the other in Music (Honours Class 1A). Throughout 2012, I deferred my university studies, as I was fortunate enough to have been accepted as an Associate to the Honourable Justice John Dowsett in the Federal Court of Australia. I am currently employed full time by the University of Queensland as a Lecturer teaching Business, Corporate and Private Law. In 2019, I fulfilled my post-degree requirements and was admitted into the Legal Profession.

Entry Information

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
- 2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- 3. The Club and MJN Show Services will not be responsible of cash sent through the mail.
- 4. The Club reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.
- 5. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
- 6. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, disqualified or barred from competition by action of the bench Committee.
- 7. Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials or unfinished Specials back to the classes is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. As of July 2, 2024 – There shall be **NO REFUNDS** for Show/Event(s) Cancellation.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

TCNs can be obtained through your CKC member portal or by contacting the CKC.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registration number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$64.00 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

Non-Member Participation Fee

Effective January 1, 2011:

- A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$170.00 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

Specialty Classes (both sexes)

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

12-15 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 15 months on day of show.

15-18 MONTHS – A dog between 15 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED – A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CLASSES:

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

STUD DOG & GET – Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. Stud Dog may be neutered. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY – Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny. Brood Bitch must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Progeny must be entered in a Regular class. Brood Bitch may be spayed. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BRACE – Two dogs shown by a single handler on one lead. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.

CH and Champion Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing* 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 or more Points allocated 0 1 2 3 4 5 *includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge <u>SHALL NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges, with at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GCH and Grand Champion Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

b) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at group level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GCHEX and Grand Champion Excellent Points

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

Altered Champion and Altered Points

Section 13.8.1 Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion [Alt] and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 4.7.1 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Moving Class Dog to Specials Only

Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Moving from Specials Back to the Classes

Section 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.

CORRECTING SHOW RESULTS – NEW FOR 2024

Section 9.9 The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than **90 DAYS** following the date(s) of the event(s).

HEALTH REMINDERS

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.



ZERO TOLERANCE – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Kars Dog Club Events will be asked to leave the Event grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit.

Definition of Bullying: Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.

Examples include:

- insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits
- spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo
- berating/belittling an individual
- unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- giving insulting Nicolaasnames
- engaging in practical jokes that humiliate
- undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work
- · physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates
- mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms
- yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles

Daytime exhibitors will be allowed to set up in designated areas. **Please see Parking/Site Attendee at time of arrival**; otherwise, you may be required to move.

Exhibitors will be expected to accept space as assigned and are expected to KEEP THEIR SPACE CLEAN. Reservations and payment in full. **Deadline July 7, 2024. *No refunds once the show entries close.**

HYDRO There is limited hydro plug-ins available - 15 amps (priority to reserved RV and Grooming Setup Sites), bring your generator should you wish to run air conditioning units. No air conditioning units are to run on the 15 amp power in order to avoid overload of power on breakers. Motorhomes with generator must have exhaust stacks or you will be relocated on show grounds away from other exhibitors – NO EXCEPTIONS

WATER Water fill available. NO full-time hookup. Water is non-potable.

TRAILER DUMPING will be available through a private company on specific days and fees will be the sole responsibility of the exhibitor. (Sat, Mon, Wed & Fri) A color ribbon can be obtained by Show Superintendent to attach to your mirror should you need a dumping service.

SHAVINGS Exhibitors are required to put plastic down prior to shaving in their ex-pens. Exhibitors are responsible for disposing of the plastic and shavings in the dumpster. **DO NOT** dispose in ringside garbage cans.

GARBAGE All Exhibitors are responsible for disposing of their garbage in the dumpster on site. No Garbage pick-up. Broken tents/pop-ups must be dismantled prior to putting in dumpster.

RINGSIDE

- No portable tents, popup tents and xpens to be placed at ringside; all Shade Tents/Grooming Tents are to be in designated areas only.
- Popup tents, portable tents, Shade accessories are required to be secured to the ground at all times.
- Ringside chairs no closer than 10 feet from the ring fencing, otherwise you will be asked to move and/or your chair may be removed.
- No chairs, crates, tables and personal belongings to be left at ringside by the ring entrance/exit or ring shade tent.
- No moving around tents while the show is in progress.
- Should non respect of above rules, you will be asked to leave the show precincts, no refund and CKC report will be filed.
