COMPETITOR INFORMATION

This is a titling event under CARO rules and regulations. CARO encourages participation by all dogs – purebred or mixed breed, pets or titled champions – who are at least 6 months of age.

(Except for bitches in season or dogs with injuries or illnesses which may cause the dog pain or discomfort, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression that threaten the safety of other dogs or humans.) An officiating Judge and/or Chairperson of the trial may dismiss from the trial site any person in breach of these guidelines or who is subjecting the Judge or members of the organizing committee to abuse.

Handlers are allowed to encourage their dogs in the ring using verbal praise and petting. Food may be used as a reward at the novice and advanced level.

Treats may not be used as a lure to help the dog complete an exercise. Food must be carried in the handler's pocket opposite the dog and can only be present in the handler's hand between exercises. Any food, praise, or petting that significantly interrupts the flow of performance shall be scored accordingly. The dogs must perform the exercises correctly and there should be a practiced smooth flow to the performance.

Rally is intended to promote positive relationships between dogs and owners based on trust and mutual respect. Dogs and handlers should both appear to be enjoying the competition and each other's company. For a complete description of the Rally rules, regulations, performance guidelines, explanation of exercises, etc. go to

Physically challenged handlers and dogs are encouraged to participate. They should provide the judge with a written description of how they intend to perform any of the course exercises along with their entry form, as modifications of the course are allowed at the judge's discretion. There will be no refunds given out for entries withdrawn after the closing date, or in the event that a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal.

If your dog is sick, please respect the other dogs and DO NOT attend the trial and seek veterinary attention. We may offer a refund with a veterinary note, however we will NOT offer a refund to any dogs we need to dismiss from the trial due to illness.

Collars and Leashes: can be shown on a flat buckle, snap collar or plain harness. No head halters, martingales, no-pull harnesses, choke chains, prong or shock collars are allowed. Leashes must be made of fabric or leather and be long enough to provide adequate slack. Dogs at the advanced level or higher are not required to wear a collar during competition.

Same day move-ups will be allowed at the trial secretary and judge's discretion.

There will be qualifying ribbons awarded to each dog who achieved a qualifying score. Titling rosette and a "High in Class" rosette will also be offered at the completion of judging.

Stream Definitions:

*The **"A" stream** is for handlers who are beginners and have never titled a dog in any sport. They have not instructed or assisted with dog training classes in any sport.

*The **"B" stream** is for handlers who have worked a dog towards, and achieved, a title in any dog sport before, or have instructed or assisted in dog training classes.

*The **"C" stream** is the Championship stream for a handler at the Excellent level and higher that would like to go back and achieve a Gold, Silver, Bronze or Masters title.

Dog ID: Dogs must have a CARO registration number in order to compete. If you do not have a CARO number for your dog when you complete this form put "pending" for your number and fill out the CARO registration form through CARO's website here: <http://www.canadianrallyo.ca/page/registerdog> It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they have a CARO dog ID number on the day of the trial.

Working Class: Working Class is a stream of rally-obedience that showcases dog's various utility skills. The exercises include retrieves, distance work, barrel racing, and more.

Any changes to entries, including cancellations, must be made to the Trial Secretary by telephone, e-mail, or in writing before 3pm Dec 9th, 2016. Cancellations received after Dec 3rd, 2016 will not be eligible for a refund of fees.

There shall be no refund for entries withdrawn after the closing date for any reason, or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. There will be no refunds if the trial has to be cancelled for any reason. If your dog is unable to compete due to a medical condition, we may be able to issue a refund upon receipt of a note from your veterinarian.

Please be sure to read ALL of the information on the premium.

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of CARO Rally Obedience rules and regulations including but not limited to any of the rules posted on this premium.

The organizing committee may refuse any entry for any reason.

Dogs must remain under control at all times whether on or off leash while on show grounds.

Please ensure you keep distance between all dogs while at the event as some dogs need extra space.

If you have a dog who needs space from other dogs or people, please attach a yellow ribbon to your dog's leash (we will have some here if you do not have your own).

Any dog engaging in aggressive behavior at any time will be required to leave the show grounds. In such cases, no refund of fees will be paid.

Please pick up after your dog and yourself. Anyone caught not picking up after themselves or their dog will be dismissed from the trial without a refund.

You must be familiar with all of the different Rally-O exercise signs prior to the event.

Go to <http://canadianrallyo.ca/page/Exercises> to find a detailed explanation of each of the signs and have fun practicing them with your dog. Then come out and strut your stuff with us!

CARO WORKING COMPETITION

Description

The Working Competition is not an entry level program. It requires off leash control and the ability of the dog to work under distracting conditions.

There are three divisions in the Working Competition - Rookie, Elite and Expert. Each of the three divisions is split into two subdivisions of five exercises.

There are six titles available to be awarded:

- CARO Working Rookie Class I CWRI
- CARO Working Elite Class I CWTI
- CARO Working Expert Class I CWXI
- CARO Working Rookie Class II CWRII
- CARO Working Elite Class II CWTII
- CARO Working Expert Class II CWXII

In order to qualify for a Working Title a dog and handler team must obtain 3 passing scores, under two different Judges, in each of the 5 exercises at the subdivision level at which they are competing.

The team does not have to pass all five exercises at once. Any exercises passed will be credited to the dog. For example, if a team passes exercise 1 and 3 but fails 2, 4 and 5 then the dog will receive credit for exercise 1 and 3.

Dogs must have a CARO RallyO Advanced title OR have successfully completed the Working Proficiency Test before competing in the Working Competition. See **Working Proficiency Test Handbook** for full requirements.

Dogs may compete in more than one level at a trial but any achievements obtained without first obtaining a pre-requisite will not be credited to the dog. If the pre-requisite is obtained at the same trial as the more advanced exercises then the successes at the more advanced level will be credited. All dogs must be off leash at this level but must enter and leave the ring on leash. Failure to comply with this will result in a FAIL as will leaving the ring during an exercise.

Progression through the Exercises. – There are four ways to progress through the exercises.

1. You may compete by sub-division, that is, you complete Rookie, then Elite then Expert at the subdivision I. You then complete Rookie, Elite and Expert at subdivision II.
2. You may compete by class, that is, you complete the Rookie classes at subdivision I then the Rookie classes at subdivision II. You then go on to Elite at subdivision I and then subdivision II and finally go on to Expert at subdivision I and subdivision II.
3. You may complete an individual exercise for example Drop on Recall at the Rookie, then Elite and then Expert levels.
4. Finally you may use any combination of the above. This progression gives both the handler and dog team and the host club the most opportunity for promoting the Working competition.

In all progressions, it is important to remember that you must have obtained the pre-requisite for the exercise you are attempting.
