General Information and Test Rules

To earn a Water Rescue Dog Novice title, Water Rescue Dog title or Water Rescue Dog Excellent title at these tests, the entrant will be required to successfully pass all the exercises as written in the NDCC Water Test Rules, you would require 3 qualifying passes under two different judges. During the test, the decision of the judges shall be final in all matters affecting the working of dogs and handlers and in evaluation of their performance.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Every foreign born and owned dog that is entered in a Canadian Kennel Club event must obtain an Event Registration Number (ERN). An Event Registration Number application must be completed and submitted along with a copy of registration documents from a CKC recognized foreign kennel club and the required fee.

CKC Tracking Fee

A CKC tracking fee will be charged for non-CKC members. The Non-Member Participation Fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in a title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.

PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregistrable dog of a CKC recognized or listed breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. In order for a dog to be eligible to receive a PEN, all of the following criteria must be met:

- 1) The dog must be of a CKC recognized or listed breed
- 2) The dog, for one reason or another, must not be eligible for CKC registration.
- 3) The dog must be spayed or neutered
- 4) The dog must be properly identified with a CKC approved microchip (this requirement is not necessary for ILP dogs)
- 5) In the case of a foreign born dog residing in the USA, in addition to the above, the dog must have been issued an AKC PAL number.

Eligibility: This test is open to all registered Newfoundland dogs six months of age or older on the day of the test. Water Rescue Dog Excellent entries must have previously earned a WRD title in order to enter the WRDX class. Re-qualifications are accepted pending 'space available.' Re-qualification shall be judged last in the level they enter. Bitches in season will be able to compete, please notify test secretary on the day of the event. The bitch must be kept away from the test area and will compete after all other dogs have finished.

Confirmation of Entry: All entrants will be notified of their placement by email, mail or telephone. Entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Closing Date: The closing date for entries is when the limit has been reached. If the limit is reached a list of alternates will be kept to fill any vacancies created due to cancellations before the test date and Day of Test Entries would be allowed. Re-qualifications are accepted pending 'space available'. Re-qualification shall be judged last in the level they enter.

ENTRIES LIMITED to 15 Newfoundland Dogs total for all 3 tests

Entry Fee: \$65(Canadian) per dog (payable to the Newfoundland Dog Club of Canada – BC Region), Mail entries to the Water Test Secretary. **PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT write "Canadian Funds" on US cheques as they are not accepted by Canadian Banks. Entry fees must be paid in Canadian Funds. Entries must be complete, signed and submitted on the official CKC entry form. The test will accept entries on a first come, first serve basis.**

Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded.

Test Regulations: All dogs entered in the Water Rescue Dog Test must go through the Basic Control Exercises, regardless of obedience titles held by entered dogs.

Equipment: Entrants must supply their own equipment. Be prepared for any weather. This event is entirely outdoors and there is no provision for cover in case of inclement weather. Government approved flotation devices and appropriate footwear must be worn by handlers during water testing.

A Medallion will be given to qualifying dogs.

Lunches: We request that you bring a lunch, but there may be snacks available as well.

HOW TO FIND US:

The Water Test will be held at Herald Provincial Park, 4861 Sunnybrae Canoe Pt. Rd., Tappen, BC V0E 2X1 in the Day Use area. Directions will be provided with entry confirmation. The park is one turn off the Trans Canada Hwy in Tappen, BC, approx. 15 minutes along Sunnybrae Canoe Pt. Road.

Herald Provincial Park has authorized our use of this park. Exhibitors must clean up after their dogs and exercise them only in designated areas. We appreciate your cooperation. This is a public campground and all entrants are guests, we request that you show good dog ownership and set an example so we can continue to use this test site.

The Water Test Committee and park operators will exercise due care and diligence for the welfare of all the dogs entered but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident or other misfortune to any dog, exhibitor, either to themselves or their property.

Complete information regarding this test will be sent out with the entry acknowledgments. If you require specific information please contact the Test Secretary.

Refreshments: Water and beverages will be available to all exhibitors, stewards and judges.

ENTRANTS PLEASE NOTE: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the level in which they are competing.
