CONFORMATION JUDGES



Tempest Deptuch Tempest Deptuch has been involved in dogs since 1974. She began her life long commitment to purebred dogs as a junior handler, showing Standard Poodles, Miniature Poodles and Afghan Hounds.

She began breeding Poodles in 1979 and has shown over 100 Canadian and American Champions including multiple Best In Show and Specialty winning dogs. One of her first home bred Standard Poodles "Buddy" Am Can Ch Diplomats Single Sensation achieved 12 all breed Best in Shows and many specialty BIS. He was always owner/breeder/handled becoming one of Canadas top winning show dogs. Along with her late husband (Sandy) Russel Fletcher they also exhibited their Whippets and Manchester Terriers. "Chatter" Am Can Ch Solitaires Can We Talk achieved 25 all breed BIS and was the Top Toy Dog in Canada two years running. They also handled top Old English Sheepdogs, Bouvier des Flandres and Petit Basset Griffon Vendéens for many other breeders.

Tempest is currently a director for the Canadian Kennel Club. She has served on the executive of All Breed and Specialty breed clubs, and has been awarded Life memberships in the Canadian Kennel Club and the Tyee Kennel Club. She has had the privilege of judging in many countries, including the USA, Korea, Australia and Africa, highlighted by the honour of judging the Poodle National in Brisbane, Australia. She runs a judges education group and has presented seminars on Poodles, Bulldogs, Boxers etc as well as canine structure.



Ernesto Lara has been a dog handler for more than 25 years, initially exhibiting in his native Mexico. Bron in Mexico, he started in dogs in the mid 70's with Airedale Terriers. His first dog was named Bengal, by the earlier 80's he started showing and before the 90's he won top dog all breeds twice, once with a Bouvier des Flandres and a Scottish Terrier. In 1994 he moved to the States to work for Mr. Peter Green

where he worked for 12 years. After that as a professional handler he has won lots of BIS with numerous breeds and placed in Montgomery Kennel Club multiple times. In 2010 he won BIS at the Purina National in Toronto, Canada with a Kerry Blue Terrier and in 2013 he won BIS at Westminster with the Affenpinscher "Banana Joe" making him the top Affenpinscher of all time with over 80 BIS in America. Ernesto has judged in Mexico, US, Canada and Argentina.



Judy McVeigh has been breeding and exhibiting Scottish Terrier, Wire Fox Terrier, Soft Coated Wheaten Terrier since 1971. She has been judging since 1993.



Richard Paquette has been involved in purebred dogs since 1971. He began his career in dogs with primarily Shih Tzu with the kennel name Wenrick, but he has also owned and bred Samoyeds, Afghans, Salukis, Whippets, Brussels Griffon, Maltese, Pekingese, Lakeland Terriers, and Wire Fox Terriers. Shih Tzu and Lakelands are his main breeds, and he has produced over 300 Canadian Champions,

150 American Champions, 20 different Best in Show winners and 12 National Specialty winning dogs.

Richard is now a retired professional dog handler, a profession he enjoyed for 15 years. During this time, he finished over 500 champions in 80 different breeds and won over 150 All Breed Best in Shows on 16 different breeds. He has served on the executives of All Breed and Specialty breed clubs and as a Director of the Canadian Kennel Club, Chair of the CKC Brachycephalic Breeds Advocacy Committee and President of the Canadian Shih Tzu Club.

Richard is a CKC Licensed All Breed judge, a founding member of the Canadian Dog Judges Association and a member of the American Dog Judges Association. In addition to Canada and the USA, he has judged in Argentina, Australia, New Zealand, Bermuda, Brazil, Colombia, Chile, Peru, Uruguay, China, Japan,

Korea, Mexico, Nicaragua, Philippines, Thailand, Taiwan, South Africa, Ghana, Uganda, Israel, Spain, Denmark, Italy, Finland, Latvia, Croatia, Russia, Sweden, and Ireland.



Alex Rojas was born in México City. Architect. / Language Teacher. I started in dog shows as amateur since 1992, competing formally since 1999. When I was a child I had dogs like Samoyed, Schnauzer and a few not purebred ones, but thanks to my love for sight hounds I bought my first show dog: an Afghan hound, I showed him and finished some offspring as national champions. In 2007 I decided to get a Saluki, showed him and getting several national and international titles. I worked as ring steward for more than 10 years,

this allowed me to participate in the World Dog Shows hold in Mexico in 1999 and 2007, Champion of champion's tournaments, world specialty shows; I also attended seminars for judges. I have been judging since 2003 and have judged in Argentina, Australia, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, El Salvador, Equator, Guatemala, Honduras, Indonesia, Jamaica, Japan, Korea, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, South Africa and Venezuela.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

Indignities to a Judge

4.1.5 No person may approach a judge whether directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within14 days of the action.

4.7.1 A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Refusal of Entries

8.6.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause.

Unsportsmanlike Conduct

11.1 It shall be deemed unsportsmanlike conduct if a person during the running of or in connection with an event abuses or harasses a judge, show official or any other person present in any capacity at the event.

11.2 Any handler who displays unsportsmanlike conduct or who is seen to kick, strike or otherwise roughly manhandle a dog at any time during the holding of the event, may be expelled from the show by the Conformation Show Committee.

11.3 The judges shall also have the authority to expel a handler from a show if they observe unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler or see the handler kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog while the event is in progress. It will be the duty of the judge to report promptly to the Conformation Show Committee the expulsion of a handler.

11.4 The Conformation Show Committee shall investigate, at once, any instance of alleged unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of the handler, or any report that a handler has been observed kicking, striking or otherwise roughly manhandling a dog. If the Conformation Show Committee, after investigation, determines that a handler is in violation of this section, and that the incident, if proven, would constitute conduct prejudicial to the sport or the CKC, it shall exercise its authority in accordance with the Complaints section of these rules.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO BREED JUDGING. TCN FEES WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

VETERAN - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and older. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY.

UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

Amateur Owner/Handler

Exhibitor Eligibility

1. Exhibitors must declare their dog Owner Handled Competition eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form or the indication of class entrance on online entry.

2. The handler must be an owner of record listed in the catalogue.

3. Professional handlers, household members and current assistants to professional handlers may not exhibit. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay or received payment for handling a dog.

4. Dogs must be handled by an owner-handler throughout the breed level competition for the regular show. This includes the class competition and subsequent competition in the breed ring. The same is true for all levels of group and show competition.

5. The Best Owner Handled in Breed will be selected from the eligible dogs that competed in the Best of Breed competition for the regular show. This includes Winners Dog, Winners Bitch. This excludes all dogs defeated during class and winners competition for the regular show.

Determining Best Owner Handled in Breed

The selection of the Best Owner Handled in Breed is held immediately following regular judging of that breed in the same ring. The ring steward will excuse all exhibitors not eligible. The judge will then award Best Owner Handled in Breed.

Judging of the breed for the regular show may determine the dog that is awarded the Best Owner Handled in Breed.

Guidelines:

• If the Best of Breed winner of the regular show is eligible for Best Owner Handled in Breed it will also be awarded Best Owner Handled in Breed. In this case the dog will be eligible to compete in group competition for the regular show and group competition for Best Owner Handled in Group.

• If the regular show Best of Breed winner is not eligible for Best Owner Handled in Breed and the regular show Best of Opposite Sex is eligible, the regular show Best of Opposite Sex to will compete against the eligible exhibits of the other sex to determine Best Owner Handled in Breed.

• If neither the Best of Breed nor the Best of Opposite Sex from the regular show is eligible for the Best Owner Handled in Breed and both the Select Dog and Select Bitch are eligible, the judge is to choose Best Owner Handled in Breed from the Selects and any eligible Winners Dog or Winners Bitch.

• If one of the Selects from the regular show is eligible for Best Owner Handled in Breed, excuse all eligible champions and then choose Best Owner Handled in Breed from the remaining eligible dogs of the opposite sex including the eligible Winners.

• If the regular show Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch are not eligible, the judge may choose any eligible dog remaining in the ring including Winners Dog or Winners Bitch as the Best Owner Handled in Breed.

If no dog remaining in the ring is eligible for the Best Owner Handled in Breed competition, no award will be made and there will not be representation in group competition for the Best Owner Handled in Group.

Group and Best in Show Competition

• In the Group and Best in Show competition, the dog must be handled throughout the competition by an eligible owner.

• Group judging for the Best Owner Handled in Group may take place in separate rings from regular group judging.

• Judging for the Best Owner Handled in Show after regular Best in Show judging.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at <u>www.ckc.ca</u>

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show and/or show grounds designated for this event as deemed appropriate by the show committee. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.

2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.

3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.

6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.

7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.

10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.

11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.

12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Vernon & District Kennel Club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting thereof, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special: (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above. 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
