Note: There will be no refunds for duplicate entries or overpayment of fees. It is the owner of the dog entered that is responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Please review email confirmations so corrections may be made **prior to closing date** to avoid disappointment.

- 4.1.5 No person may approach a judge whether directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within14 days of the action.
- 8.5.1 The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause.
- 9.9 The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to the results if received more than 90 days following the date of the event.
- 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to CKC any infringement of this regulation, and CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

The precincts of these events will be all areas of the venue reserved for the sole use of the show giving club.

BORDER CROSSING

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada. Government regulations require this Certificate and MUST be dated at least 30 days prior to re-entry into the US.

^{*} TCN fee is payable with the entry fee if the dog has a CKC Temporary Competitive Number. Any dog that does not have a registration number must apply for a TCN number from CKC.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

HOW TO: APPLY FOR A TCN ONLINE

A TCN (Temporary Competition Number) allows a dog that is eligible for CKC registration and/or an Event Registration Number (ERN) to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

1. Visit www.ckc.ca and click the red LOGIN button at the top right hand side of CKC's homepage.



2. On the login page, login to your Portal account.



- individuals who haven't used the online portal yet will be required to create a portal account before they can submit a TCN application. If you have not yet created a Portal account, see Creating a CKC Portal Account.
- 3. Once logged in, you will arrive at your Dashboard.

4. On the right hand side of your Homepage, select "Dog Register", under the Quick Links section. This will take you to the online Dog Registration Application.





Under "Competing in Events Only", select "Temporary Competition Number (TCN) - ..." from the registration type options.



Competing in Events Only

- Canine Companion Number (CCN) Allows mixed breed and purebred dogs of breeds not recognized by CKC to participate in some CKC performance events.
- Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MCN) Allows listed breeds and purebred breeds not fully recognized or registered with CKC to enter an event and obtain titles. An MCN must be obtained prior to entering an event.
- Performance Event Number (PEN) Allows an unregistrable dog of a CKC-recognized or listed breed to participate in most performance events.
- Temporary Competition Number (TCN). Allows a dog that is eligible for CKC registration and/or an Event Registration Number (ERN) to participate in CKC events on a temporary basis. Dogs must be fully registered in order to receive titles.
- Complete the Dog's Information section with the appropriate Information.
- Under the Owner section, add information for at least one contact (for the primary owner).

- After you enter in all of the required information click the red SUBMIT button.
- 10. After a brief waiting period for the application to process, click the red CONTINUE on the next screen.

Success! Your application has been submitted. Please click on continue button to perform next steps. Note: Do out fit Dank button of your browner.

This will generate a new screen with your dog's TCN number.

REMINDERS:

- A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.
- The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.
- A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a PEN (Performance Event Number) or CCN (Canine Companion Number).

CONFORMATION CLASSE

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 15 MONTHS - This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 15 months of age on the day of the show.

15 to 18 MONTHS - This class shall be for any dog 15 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show.

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs divided by colour.

VETERAN CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and under 9 years, 9-11 years and 11+ years and older on the day of the show. Dogs in this class may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. Listing Fees WILL NOT be refunded

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

BABY PUPPY - This class is for all dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show.

BRACE - This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

STUD DOG & GET - This shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership need not be identical. The stud dog may be spay/neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY - the same requirements as the Stud Dog & Get

JUVENILE SWEEPSTAKES - Saturday, May 24th, 2025 preceeding Conformation

Judge: Michelle Yeadon

Juvenile Sweepstakes is to all Cavalier puppies four months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following ten classes (divided by sex):

> 4 months and under 6 months 6 months and under 9 months 9 months and under 12 months 12 months and under 15 months 15 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 35% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 30% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes 1st in each class - rosette & 10% of specific class fees 25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Veteran Sweepstakes

Judge: Michelle Yeadon

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Cavalier dogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular class or for exhibition only on the same day. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in exhibition only. Dogs to be judged in one of the following six classes (divided by sex):

> 7 years and under 9 years 9 years and under 11 years 11+ years and over

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Veteran Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes Runner Up in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

JUNIOR HANDLING, SATURDAY, May 24th, 2025 Following Conformation

Judge: Michelle Yeadon

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to one hour prior with no exceptions.

Entry fee: FREE

The following classes will be provided:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years Junior Open - 7 to 10 years Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

Note: Pee Wees do not compete for best overall.

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only at this specialty. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Pee Wees - prize and flat ribbon

Best Overall Handler - rosette and prize

1st in each class- prize and rosette

2nd to 4th in each class - rosettes

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Chairperson.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)
- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022

AGREEMENT
