

JUDGES PROFILE

Michelle Scott, ON, Canada



Michelle has been involved with purebred dogs her whole life. She grew up with Irish Setters. She has bred and owned Akitas, Maltese, Lakeland Terriers, all three varieties of Poodles, and now Brussels Griffons and a Dandie Dinmont Terrier.

Michelle was a professional handler until 1998 when she retired and began her judging career. She is now approved as an all-breed judge and has judged in Canada, the US, Denmark, Colombia, Argentina, Australia, Mexico, the Philippines, China, and Japan.

Peter Scott, ON Canada



Peter started breeding Maltese in the 1970s. This eventually led to a career as a professional handler that spanned some 40 years.

He has, along with his wife Michelle, also bred Lakeland Terriers, Poodles, and most recently Dandie Dinmont Terriers.

Peter retired from handling several years ago and is now a CKC licensed judge for Groups 4, 6, and half of 5, and on permit for the other half of 5

Donna Conad, ON Canada



My mother, Betty Conod passed her incredible passion for dogs to me making me a second-generation dog person. Our first dog, a Great Dane was acquired in 1953. She earned her championship in 1954 and was our foundation bitch. (Ch Delta of Tollurst)

Whisper Hill Kennel registered with the CKC in 1962, and has produced multiple BIS, BISS, American and Canadian Champions along with a number one Great Dane and number five Working dog in the country.

My Goal was always to judge, and that came true for me in 2002.

As a handler, I have shown across Canada and the USA. Other breeds I have had an active involvement with include Pharaoh Hounds, Mini-smooth and Standard Smooth Dachshunds, Mini and Toy Poodles, American Cocker Spaniels, Wire Haired Fox Terriers and Shih Tzu's. My two heart

breeds though are Great Danes (since a child) and The German Shepherd Dog, which I have had an active involvement in breeding and showing for the past 35 years. I had the pleasure of judging Bitches at the 2014 German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada's National Specialty, and judged Intersex and Dogs for the same club in 2019. I have judged multiple breed specialties, and all breed shows internationally. It was an honor to be invited to judge the Finnish Great Dane National, The Canadian Great Dane National and the USA Top 20.

It has been a pleasure to judge in other countries including Australia, Mexico, Finland, China, Japan, Philippines, Argentina, Columbia, Jamaica, USA, Bolivia and Canada. There is nothing more fulfilling than the world of dogs which has consumed most of my life.

Currently I am active in several dog clubs including the Great Dane Club of Canada, Great Dane Club of America, German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada, German Shepherd Dog Club of America, Vice-President of Forrest City Kennel Club, Canadian Dog Judges Association and the American Dog Judges Association. I am licensed by the Canadian Club to judge all Breeds.

I have judged specialty, and all breed shows in all the American countries (except Paraguay) as well as in Australia, New Zealand, Thailand, Japan, Indonesia, Malaysia, India, Ireland, Russia, China and South Africa. In 2015 I was honored by being appointed to judge the Wire variety at the DCA National in USA.

Guillermo Cavazos, Mexico



I began my career as a ring steward the age of 16 in my hometown of Saltillo, Coahuila, in northern Mexico. I enthusiastically collaborated with the local club for several years. During this time, I informally showed dogs for club members under the guidance of my first mentor, Alejandro Pena Ledezma, a Miniature Poodle breeder.

In 1990, I was admitted to the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM) to pursue a degree in DVM. I took the Dog Breeds course with DVM José Luis Payor Dueñas and Canine and Feline Zootechnics with DVM Elizardo Valadez Franco, both recognized judges of the Mexican

Kennel Club (FCM). I completed my DVM degree with a thesis on Dog Hair Care and Grooming, providing detailed descriptions of grooming, care and diseases for 56 different dog breeds.

In December 1993, during the FCM's international winter circuit, I won my first Best In Show (BIS) with a German Shorthair Pointer. In 1994, I moved to Arizona, USA, to work under the guidance of Clay Coady, a renowned handler specializing in terriers. He helped refine my knowledge and skills in grooming, handling, and expanded my understanding of numerous breeds. Upon returning to Mexico, I resumed my career, achieving BIS with various breeds, including Dog of the Year with an English Mastiff that earned 27 BIS in 1997. This same dog led to the FCM awarding me Handler of the Year. Besides Mexico, I competed in the USA, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Puerto Rico, Cuba, El Salvador, Spain, Portugal, Czech Republic and Finland, achieving championships in each of these countries, as well as multiple group winners and some BIS. Notable achievements include Best of Breed with the breed Mastiff at the World Dog Show in Helsinki, and BIS at the Americas and Caribbean Show with a German Shorthair Pointer in San José, Costa Rica. During this period, the FCM appointed me as an Authorized Litter Inspector, a role I performed for 5 years. I also served as part of the teaching staff for the Dog Grooming Diplomat offered by the FCM.

While at an exhibition in Costa Rica, I met Marlene Mastellari, a talented breeder from Panama who later became my wife. Upon moving to Mexico, we joined forces, continuing her breeding program for Shih Tzus, Welsh Corgi Pembroke's, and adding Beagles under the Darleen prefix, recognized by the Federation Cynologique International (FCI). Over the years, we achieved championships in Argentina, Cuba, Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, Panama, Peru, El Salvador, and the USA.

In 2002, we relocated to Guadalajara, Mexico, while simultaneously exhibiting dogs for clients. That same year, I established a veterinary clinic, which operated for two years. In 2004, we immigrated to Phoenix, Arizona, to expand professional horizons. Since then, we have served as dog handlers for all 7 AKC groups. Upon moving to the USA, I founded DogCommunity.net, a network dedicated to optimizing handling skills for dog owners through three classes per week in different locations of Phoenix.

I started judging all breeds in the FCM in 2014, initially at the national level eventually reaching international status. To date, I have judged in different countries in North, Central and South America, an activity that has brought personal growth and deepened my knowledge of multiple breeds. During these years, I attended numerous breed seminars conducted by the American Kennel Club (AKC) and the Dog Judges Association of America (DJAA).

In 2021, I founded the project called "Platicas Caninas", the first Spanish-language podcast dedicated to the purebred dog sport, along with a YouTube channel featuring over 180 educational videos covering all breeds and specialized shows. Notable events include the World Dog Show 2021 in Brno, Crufts 2022 and 2023, World Dog 2022 in Madrid, World Dog Show 2023 in Geneva, and the upcoming World Dog Show 2024 in Zagreb among many others. In 2022, I was accepted as a member of the World Dog Press Association (WDPA), based in Belgium, for my merits as an article writer in various print and digital media, including El Canófilo and Perros Pura Sangre (FCM official Gazete) in Mexico, Molosos de Arena, in Spain, and Show Beagles Worldwide, in the Czech Republic.

Kim Hamel, BC, Canada



I started in dogs in 1988 with a purebred English Springer Spaniel followed shortly after with a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel. This began a journey that has had many twists and turns. Along the way, my learning curve as a breeder and as an exhibitor was steep but enjoyable and very rewarding. I was fortunate to have placed in the Top Obedience totals as per DIC with my ESS and was in the top 5 for conformation with my Cavaliers for a couple of years running. I still own the only Cavalier to have won our Canadian National Speciality on two separate occasions. Recently I added a saucy Norwich Terrier to my household who finished very quickly and now competes in Rally and obedience. I have owned and shown a variety of breeds over the years which have included Springers, Cavaliers, Yorkshire terriers, Chihuahuas, Beagles, Dachshunds, Kerry Blue terriers, Keeshond, Sheltie, German Shepherds, and Norwich terriers.

I started judging in 2005 with approval for Group 1. I am the past president of the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club of Mid Western Canada, past president of Manitoba Sporting Dog Association, member of the English Springer Spaniel Club of Canada, CKCSCC, CKCSC of BC. Was secretary for the Red River Terrier Club in Manitoba and secretary/treasurer of CDJA Manitoba Chapter and current member of CDJA and now chair of VIDJSG. I also served one term as Manitoba Director on the Board of Directors for CKC.

I am now approved to judge groups 1, 5, 6 and 7.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from the CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

 The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **MOUNTAIN DAYLIGHT TIME.**
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.
- 13. If you are unable to attend due to COVID or any other ailment, it is your responsibility to find an alternative handler for your dog. No refund will be given.
- 14 **CDKC has a zero tolerance** of abuse of any description involving any person involved with the CDKC shows, including spectators. individuals will be asked to leave the show grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds.
- 15. Because of incidents with the RV Camping on the Soccer Field, at the 2024 Dog Shows, and neglect for sprinkler heads and grassed areas the Club will be collecting \$50.00 (refundable after inspection before leaving) for any damages to the facility during your stay.

JUNIOR PUPPY - 6 months & under 9 months on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY- 9 months & under 12 months on the day of the show

12-18 MONTH CLASS - for dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED - for dogs born in Canada, Champions in any country excluded.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR - shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

OPEN CLASS - shall be for all Dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs which have a recorded CKC registration, Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and have attained the required points for Championship status. All awards earned at the show will be cancelled if it is found that a dog is not registered or has not completed the requirements for a CKC Championship

The following classes will be provided, divided by sex. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

VETERAN CLASS - In this optional class for All Breed Shows, dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. The awards for this class are: Best Male Veteran and Best Female Veteran Best Veteran in Breed Best Veteran in Group Best Veteran in Show. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Breed is not

required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Group is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Show.

BABY PUPPY CLASS – Dogs 3 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

ALTERED- Altered will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Altered in Group and Best Altered in Show. All dogs must be surgically altered to enter this show.

EXHIBITION ONLY - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.

entry form. All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as for a dog entered for competition. No dog so entered can compete in any Regular class, however it may be entered in and compete in any Unofficial Class. A listing fee is not required for a listed dog entered in Exhibition Only (not entered for any competition).

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

- 15.1.9 A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.
- 15.1.10 Permission shall be granted to a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group.
- 15.1.11 A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.
- 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges;
- (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN);
- (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.
- 15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean: (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Breed or group placing.

As of July 2021, the rules for awarding of Grand Champion and Grand Champion Excellent have changed. Please see CKC Conformation Rule 15.2 Grand Champion (GCH) & 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GCHEX) for details




