GERARDO BERNARD graduated with a degree in marketing and business administration, has been involved in the dog world since he was 12 years old. His interest in dog shows began with his aunt, with Labrador Retrievers and German Shorthaired Pointers. He competed as a Junior Handler right from the time he first started in the dog world and between 1999 and 2003 he was in the Top 4 Junior Handlers in Mexico. As a Junior, he handled Labrador Retrievers, American Cocker Spaniels, German Shorthaired Pointers, Golden Retrievers and Dobermans. Along with his aunt, he has bred Labrador Retrievers and German Shorthaired Pointers under the FCI registered kennel name:

"ALGERLAND". He has also owned a Weimaraner and a German Wirehaired Pointer. He has exhibited dogs and has made up, Grand Mexican, American, Grand American, International, Pan-American, Latin-American and FCI-World championships. He has also placed his dogs as number 1 in the group (FCI group 7) in Mexico for several years. In 2003 Gerardo was granted his Judge's license from the Federación Canófila Mexicana, A.C. He has assisted Judge's seminars, handler's seminars, training seminars and grooming seminars both in Mexico and in the USA; and has been part of the Junior Handler seminar given by the Federación Canófila Mexicana, AC and speaker of different lectures in judge's seminars. Gerardo works at the Federación Canófila

Mexicana, A.C. in the dog shows department, and is involved with the activities for the youngsters in the country (Seminars, junior handlers, and workshops of kids). He was appointed, by the FCI, as one of the founding members of the FCI Youth. Initiative proposed by FCI's present to encourage children, youngsters, and young adult to participate in cynological activities around the world. He is teacher at the FCM Veterinary School in the subject "Dog Show Judging" He has judged shows in different states in Mexico, and judged in the USA, in Central and South America, Asia and Australia.



MARGARET JONES Health Care Administrator who has been showing and training dogs since 1965, when I obtained my first Irish setter. Since then my husband and I have shared our home with Irish Setters, Cairn Terriers, Boxers and a number of different breeds including, Doberman Pinschers, a Great Dane, Afghan Hound and a Tibetan Mastiff.

As a small breeding kennel we raised and bred Irish Setters, Boxers and Cairn Terriers under the Kian Prefix and exhibited them to Group, Specialty and Best in Show wins.

We gained top Dog Awards and many Obedience titles with our Irish Setters and Boxers. Cairn terriers do not excel in the Obedience ring but they love to work at Rally, Scent detection and Earth sports.

As an All breed Judge I have been privileged to judge many times at All Breed and Specialty shows in Asia, Australia, Europe, South Africa, South America, U.K., Canada and USA.

I am a Life member of the Canadian Kennel Club and served as a Director of the Canadian Kennel Club Board from 2003-2011. During that time, I served on several Committees and Co-Chaired the CKC Charity Dog Show

I am Past President of the Canadian Dog Judges Association and Immediate Past President of the BC All Terrier Club, Cairn terrier Club Canada, and Tyee Kennel Club.

I am still actively involved with local and National Breed Clubs.



DR. LUCIE PARADIS, mv Breeder Pembroke Welsh Corgi since 1978 under Joska kennel perm reg I graduated from veterinarian school in Montreal in 1977, I am semi retired and still practice in Quebec city in small animal practice, at Clinique Maguire Médecine Vétérinaire, wich I just sold to my ex partner Marie-Christine Lefrançois, dmv. The Clinic specialize in reproduction, we have a 60% dogs 40% cats practice. I owned my first Corgi in 1978 from Polruan kennel (Rosalie Harvie), who was my mentor in the breed. I have bred many canadian and american champions, have done obedience, rally and recently in agility. I am not breeding as much these last years, but still own 6 Corgis. CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS – This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS – This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS – This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS – This class shall be for any dog born in Canada.
(Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS – This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler **MUST** be the owner/co- owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS – This class shall be for all dogs

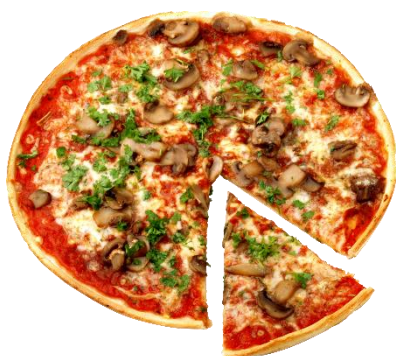
SPECIALS ONLY CLASS – This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class **MUST** be received by the Show Secretary **ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE BREED JUDGING** on that day. TCN Fees **WILL NOT** be refunded

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class **MAY NOT COMPETE** in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades **ONLY**

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS – This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The awards for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group, Best Baby Puppy in Show (This class will be held on completion of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and **PRIOR** to Best in Show)

OWNER HANDLER - You must enter this class (no fee) to be considered.

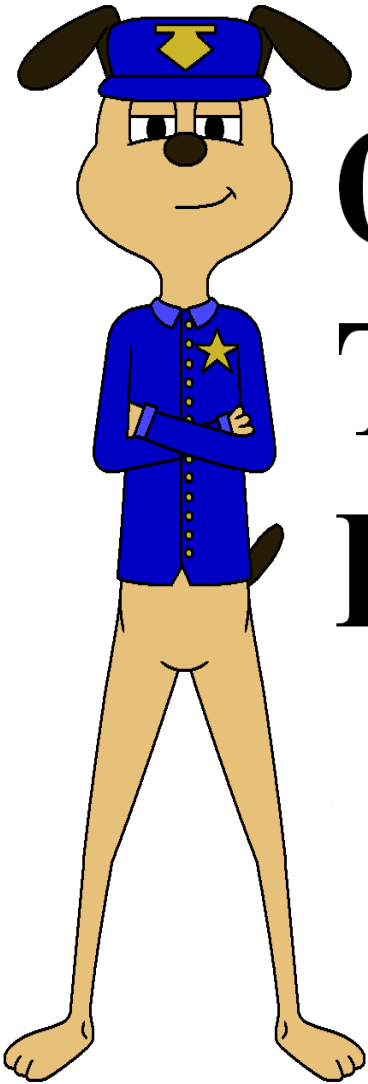

PLEASE REMEMBER TO CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG. Any exhibitor caught not cleaning up after their dog will be subject to expulsion from further competition. Please... to **ensure our continued use of this site.**

No dogs are permitted in the washrooms.

Exhibitors may not dispose of water from buckets or tubs in the garbage cans.

Do NOT overfill the garbage bins, please let a club member know that they are full.

The welfare of any children is deemed to be the responsibility of the guardian or parent. Please exercise control and restraint over your child's behaviour.

The club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or vendors/concessions. Check for lost property at the club table.

2. ENTER Online



A service charge of 10% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online or post using a credit card or Interac for payment.

ALL Entries **MUST** be received by closing date: **WEDNESDAY, June 21st, 2023 @ 9:00pm Pacific Time**

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

Owner Handler Exhibitor Eligibility (OH - Wednesday)

Unofficial/Exhibitor Eligibility

1. Exhibitors must declare their dog Owner Handled Competition eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form (either paper or electronic). If the handler changes from the time of entry to exhibition, the exhibitor is responsible for advising the ring steward if the entrant is no longer eligible.
2. The handler must be an owner of record listed in the catalogue.
3. Professional handlers, household members and current assistants to professional handlers may not exhibit. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay or received payment for handling a dog.
4. Dogs must be handled by an owner-handler throughout the breed level competition for the regular show. This includes the class competition and subsequent competition in the breed ring. The same is true for all levels of group and show competition.
5. The Best OH in Breed will be selected from the eligible dogs that competed in the Best of Breed competition for the regular show. This includes Winners Dog, Winners Bitch. This excludes all dogs defeated during class and winners competition for the regular show.

Determining Best OH in Breed

The selection of the Best OH in Breed is held immediately following regular judging of that breed in the same ring. The ring steward will excuse all exhibitors not eligible. The judge will then award Best OH in Breed. Judging of the breed for the regular show may determine the dog that is awarded the Best OH in Breed.

Guidelines:

- If the Best of Breed winner of the regular show is eligible for Best OH in Breed it will also be awarded Best OH in Breed. In this case the dog will be eligible to compete in group competition for the regular show and group competition for Best OH in Group.
 - If the regular show Best of Breed winner is not eligible for Best OH in Breed and the regular show Best of Opposite Sex is eligible, the regular show Best of Opposite Sex will compete against the eligible exhibits of the other sex to determine Best OH in Breed.
 - If neither the Best of Breed nor the Best of Opposite Sex from the regular show is eligible for the Best OH in Breed and both the Select Dog and Select Bitch are eligible, the judge is to choose Best OH in Breed from the Selects and any eligible Winners Dog or Winners Bitch.
 - If one of the Selects from the regular show is eligible for Best OH in Breed, excuse all eligible champions and then choose Best OH in Breed from the remaining eligible dogs of the opposite sex including the eligible Winners.
 - If the regular show Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch are not eligible, the judge may choose any eligible dog remaining in the ring including Winners Dog or Winners Bitch as the Best OH in Breed. If no dog remaining in the ring is eligible for the Best OH in Breed competition, no award will be made and there will not be representation in group competition for the Best OH in Group and Best OH in Show Competition.
- In the Group and Best in Show competition, the dog must be handled throughout the competition by an eligible owner.
- Group judging for the Best OH in Group may take place in separate rings from regular group judging.
 - Judging for the Best OH in Show after regular Best in Show judging.

JUNIOR HANDLING - THURSDAY, JULY 13TH, 2023 AT NOON

Judges: Allison Alexander

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to 11:00 am on Sunday with no exceptions.

The following classes will be provided:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years

Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years

Junior Open - 7 to 10 years

Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years

Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years

Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years

Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

Note: Pee Wees do not compete for best overall.

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only on the applicable Saturday or Sunday. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Pee Wees - a participant ribbon and prize

Best Overall Handler – rosette and prize

First in each class - rosette and prize

2nd to 4th in each class - ribbon and prize

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from:

CKC online at www.ckc.ca

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
4. A judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
6. **DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING.** The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog **BEFORE** taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.
13. The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.
14. Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please **DO NOT** make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.
15. No person may approach a judge wither directly or otherwise, orally, in writing or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Vancouver Island Dog Fanciers Association, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
