

ENTRY AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules" and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Northern Alberta Canine Association has the right to refuse this entry for just cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of entries made in these all-breed shows, obedience trials, agility trials or any of the associated Specialties, and of the holding of these shows and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Northern Alberta Canine Association and associated Specialty Clubs, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents, or show secretaries, and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club(s) or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in these shows and trials, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

1. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building.
2. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of these shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
3. ANYONE PARKING IN THE FIRE LANES OR OTHER AREAS DESIGNATED AS "OFF LIMITS" WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOW.
4. All recreational units must have buckets underneath for their drains. Those discharging of any water on the grounds will be removed by order of the health department and subject to a fine.
5. A judge officiating at this show held under CKC rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. (4.7.1)
6. A show-giving club will be held responsible during the show for the conduct of exhibitors and spectators. Any person acting in an abusive or objectionable manner must be removed from the show on complaint to the Show Superintendent (5.1.6)
7. There is to be NO SMOKING in the large show tent, nor entrances to it, and NO SMOKING is allowed in the show building.
8. Dogs must be on the show grounds 1 hour prior to judging of their breed.
9. All vehicles are left on the show grounds at your own risk. No security is provided.
10. No abuse of parking personnel, NACA members or volunteers will be tolerated!!
11. RV's will not be allowed to travel on the show grounds when judging is occurring. Under special circumstances (in case of emergency) the show superintendent will stop the show and parking personnel will assist in the safe removal of vehicle.

Introducing Our Judges

PEGGY BEISEL-MCILWAINE – It wasn't until high school that Peggy Beisel-McIlwaine discovered the world of dog shows. After graduating in 1973 she bought her first show dog, an Old English Sheepdog. She continued her education by attending the University of Wisconsin in Green Bay, and showing her dog on weekends.

In 1977 Peggy began a three year apprenticeship with Terrier master George Ward, where she discovered her love for terriers, specifically Wire Fox Terriers. It was also during her apprenticeship with Ward that Peggy met her husband to be, Sandy McIlwaine. They married in 1980, establishing Foxairn Kennels in Ann Arbor, specializing in Wire Fox and Cairn terriers. One notable handling client, among others in their thriving business, was the legendary Cairn breeder Mrs. Betty Hyslop, of Ontario, Canada.

Peggy and Sandy have three sons, Patrick, Trevor and Ian, and one daughter-in-law, Cara. In 1996 Peggy retired from the demands of professional handling and was approved to judge the Terrier Group and Junior Showmanship. She is also approved to judge the Sporting and Herding Groups, and several additional breeds. She has judged internationally, with assignments in the UK, Australia, Scandinavia, the Philippines, South America, Mexico and China. She has judged at Westminster on five occasions, and in 2006 judged the Terrier group. She has judged at the AKC/Eukanuba Invitational show on a few occasions and judged the Terrier group in 2012. She has judged breeds at the famous Montgomery County Terrier show on several occasions and in 2010 she was honored by judging Best in Show at this famous Terrier show.

In her spare time, Peggy's time is consumed with her family, her kennel and judging. In addition, Peggy is an avid sports fan, her favorites being the Green Bay Packers, the Detroit Red Wings, Pistons, Tigers and the University of Michigan. She also enjoys reading and movies. Peggy is a member of the Detroit Kennel Club in which she has many duties, Westchester Kennel Club, and many of their breed clubs. Peggy and Sandy no longer breed Cairns or Wires and now share their home with a colored bull terrier named Sport and a white bull bitch named Lily. (Mrs. Beisel-McIlwaine is also judging the Cairn Terrier Club of Canada Specialty at this show).

JEAN DELISLE – I have been breeding and exhibiting American Cocker Spaniels since the early 1990's under the Kebec's prefix. Most of my dogs are Canadian and American Champions and some are FCI International Champions.

I always seek improvement for my dogs as for myself. With me as breeder/owner/handler, my dogs have won all-breed Best in Shows, Best in USA Specialty Shows and Best in Canadian Nationals. Recently, in 2011 at the World Dog Show in Paris, my parti color dog won the Breed and became World Champion. In 2013 my parti color girl won Variety at the World Gundog Show in 2013 and was short listed for the Best in Show. And at the World Dog Show in Budapest in 2013 she was Vice World Winner. She also became Europasiieger at the Dortmund (Germany) Show. The 2013 World Junior Winner was sired by a Kebec's ASCOB dog. My dogs are also Gundogs Best in Show winners in Europe, South America and the Caribbean.

I have stopped breeding and my journey brings me now to consider another aspect of the dog show scene as I am starting to judge (Permit). I am a member of the Canadian Dog Judges Association and the St. Lawrence Region Dog Judge's Association.

ROBERTO DEL PUERTO – Summerland English Cocker, is a member of the Argentine English Cocker Spaniel Club since 1965. It was in 1971 that Summerland Kennel had imported from England a well-known and beautiful black bitch, Colinwood Blacklace. She was mated in Argentina by a great black dog, SH.CH. Lochranza It's A Pleasure, and this was the beginning of the "Summerland line" foundation.

A very careful line breeding from more than 15 generations gave to our breed the most important Solid English Cocker of South America, Gr.Ch. Summermoon Beaming Beard (Chancy) (1983-1995), who is still the record winning English Cocker of Argentina, #1 during five consecutive years. He got 3 Titles of America's Champion and 22 all-breed Best in Shows. He said good bye to the show ring when he was seven years old, after winning his last all-breed BIS under Mrs. Anne Rogers Clark at the Argentine Rural Society Show. "Chancy" has been a gorgeous stood dog; he is always present in the pedigree of our Summerlands. Actually, Summerland Copper Shine, a golden dog, is the top English Cocker of Argentina, BISS winner and Best Gundog 2010. Summerland Cocker have earned

Championship titles and successful placements at important shows in Spain, Italy, Russia, Canada, EE UU, Brazil, Chile, Peru, Bolivia, Uruguay, and, of course, Argentina.

Mr. del Puerto is an all-rounder FCI Judge. He has judged in Chile, Uruguay, Brazil, Peru, Bolivia, Venezuela, Canada, Ecuador and Argentina. He has judged Best in Show at the 2008 Ottawa Show of Shows, has judged in other Canadian provinces and at the World Dog Show Argentina in 2005 and the Eukanuba Cup Argentina in 2002. He has also judged several specialty shows of English and American Cocker Spaniels, Labrador Retrievers, Golden Retrievers, Boxers, Doberman Pinschers, American Staffordshire and Airedale Terriers, and Dachshunds. (*Mr. del Puerto is also judging the Chow Chow Club of Canada National Specialty at this show*)

JOANNE FERNALL – I have been breeding Labrador Retrievers for over twenty years. My kennel name Devonsleigh was registered in 1993 and is permanently registered. I am currently the President of the Eastern Ontario Labrador Breeders Association and the Pug Club of Canada. I am the Regional Show Chair for both of these clubs. Over the years I have organized several Handling Seminars, Educational Seminars, Sanction Matches and CERF eye clinics. I have bred and owned several Champions including a Best in Show, Best Puppy in Show, Best Puppy in Specialty Show and Best Baby Puppy in Show. I've also produced dogs that have achieved High in Trial in Obedience and that have won Retriever Trials. I have completed my permit for the first half of the Sporting Group and am now working on my permit for the second half. I am truly enamored with dogs and am privileged to share my life with these wonderful creatures! (*Ms. Fernall is also judging the Pug Club of Canada National Specialty Sweepstakes at this show*).

SHAWN KELLY – I was introduced to the world of dogs in 1999 when my wife Patty and I got our first Golden Retriever. We began obedience classes with Tucker and it wasn't long before my competitive nature took over! Upon retiring from competitive fastpitch softball in 2000, I began competing in obedience trials and by 2008 Tucker and I had earned Rally Excellent, Agility, Canine Good Neighbour, and our coveted MOTCH title.

In 2000, along came Freelins Java Jolt, whose natural retrieving abilities led me to pursue Junior Hunt and Working Certificate titles, in addition to her Rally, Obedience, Agility, and show titles.

By 2006 my interest in both obedience and rally obedience had peaked, and being a "rules person" I decided to pursue judging. I successfully obtained my rally license in 2009 and in 2011 earned my obedience credentials. I enjoy competing and judging equally, and am currently working towards OTCH with Archer.

I was born and raised in Halifax, NS, grew up with 5 brothers and sisters, graduated from St. Mary's University and have been employed by the Federal Government for more than 22 years. Patty and I have been married for 26 years, reside in Tantallon, NS, and currently have 4 Golden Retriever; Java 13, Summer 11, Midas and Archer 8, and a Ragdoll cat (best buddy and the boss of all the dogs!).

Thank you to the Northern Alberta Canine Association for the invitation to judge this weekend and good luck to all competitors!

NORMAN B. KENNEY – of Cross Roads, Texas, has been involved in the sport of dogs for more than 46 years. His initial breed was Doberman Pinschers. He later bred, owned, and has shown a number of other breeds, including German Shepherd Dogs, Wirehaired Dachshunds, Lakeland Terriers, Norwich Terriers, Wire Fox Terriers and Belgian Malinois.

An AKC judge for 35 years, Norm is approved to judge all Sporting, Working, Terrier, Toy, Non-Sporting, Herding, and several Hound breeds.

Norm has judged extensively throughout the United States, Japan, Australia, Canada, Italy, Philippines, Jamaica, Trinidad, Brazil, Columbia, and Argentina. He has judged the Westminster KC Show many times, including the honor of judging the Working Group in 2007. Norm has also recently judged the Working Group at the AKC Eukanuba Invitational. (*Mr. Kenney is also judging the Bouvier des Flandres Specialty at this show*.)

EDWARD (Ted) LESLIE – Ted has been a licensed Obedience judge since 2002 and also judges Rally Obedience. He has been involved with the sport since 1979, trialing first with a Boxer and since then with Border Collies. He has extensive Flyball experience as well. He is a retired teacher with thirty-five years in the classroom. Over the last several years he has taken up fly fishing.

THOMAS NESBITT – a CKC licensed all-breed judge. I have been a lover of dogs all of my life. While at University I owned a Siberian Husky who taught me a great deal about that breed – enough to know that I was smitten with the dog show bug. In 1964 I became involved with American Cocker Spaniels. They were truly my first love in pure-bred dogs. I acquired the kennel name “Prelude” which is now permanently registered. We, my partner David Swartwood and I, have owned and shown Dalmatians, English Bulldogs, Pugs and English Springer Spaniels. Over the past 20 years David and I have become known for our Miniature Wire Haired Dachshunds (my retirement breed). We are involved in Agility and Obedience training and run a boarding kennel at our hobby farm in Gananoque, Ontario.

We (David is also a judge) have had the privilege of judging in many countries including the Bahamas, Bermuda, Mexico, Argentina, Australia, New Zealand, Costa Rica, Ireland, Japan, Indonesia, Chile, Colombia, South Africa and the United States. I have been particularly privileged to judge the Garden Specialties in New York on three occasions just prior to the Westminster Kennel Club shows.

I have been judging since 1994 and have judged numerous specialties including English Springers, American Cockers, English Cockers, Dachshund Club of America, Welsh Corgies, Pekingese, Shih Tzu, Dalmatians, Jack Russell Terriers, Boston Terriers, Newfoundland Dogs, Belgian Shepherds, Canadian Borzoi Nationals, Canadian Bloodhound Nationals, Canadian Lowchen Nationals. I have also had the privilege of judging several Norwegian Elkhound specialties in the USA.

Surrounded by our dogs and a wide variety of farm animals including: llamas, donkeys, goats, sheep, peacocks, guinea hens, turkeys, ducks, geese and many varieties of chickens, David and I enjoy country living. With at least two of every species the neighbours have come to call me Noah! Professionally, I was a professional fundraiser for Health Charities and at the time that I took early retirement I was the Executive Director of Canadian Guide Dogs for the Blind.

SUSAN NORRIS-JONES – After a childhood filled with all sorts of animals, I was introduced to the purebred fancy via hunting and obedience trials. In 1974 I was given an Akita bitch and discovered Conformation. Her son became my first homebred champion, and one of the first Akitas in Canada to earn a championship and a C.D. Our breeding program went on to produce numerous Canadian and American champions, multiple Best in Specialty winners and Awards of Merit. SunoJo Akitas can be seen in the pedigrees of top winning Akitas around the world.

In 1986 Shiba Inus joined the SunoJo family and have earned multiple Best in Show and Best in Specialty, Groups and Puppy Groups, Specialty wins, Awards of Merit, and top rankings in Canada, the US and around the world. Somehow along the way I became enthralled with the Toys – so much so that Japanese Chins joined (and took over) the household in 1996.

As well as Conformation, I have been involved with obedience and agility, and have served on the executive of all-breed and breed clubs. I started judging in 1996, and am licensed for the Working, Toy, Non-Sporting groups, half of the Herding Group, and on permit for the other half. Judging is a privilege that I greatly appreciate and enjoy immensely. (*Mrs. Norris-Jones is also judging the Akita Club of Alberta Specialty at this show.*)

FELICITY ANN PRIDEAUX – My love affair with dogs started at 18 months of age when I was given a Boxer bitch puppy. We were constant companions and I have had dogs ever since. My next dog was an Australian Terrier and then we had Cairn Terriers as pets for many years. Pugs came into our family after the death of one of our Cairns and from then on there has never been another breed for us. Our first Pug, although registered, was from what we later discovered to be a backyard breeder and as she was only purchased as a pet, was spayed. We were recommended to a wonderful vet who several months later rang us to say that he had found us a lovely black Pug puppy – suitable company for “Koki”. We went to see the pups with the aim of buying another little bitch – we came away with a black dog, who the breeders wanted us to show. We became hooked!

Whilst our beloved black never titled, I have shown 14 dogs through to their Australian Championship titles with many BIS, BISS, Grp Winners, Grand Champions and #1 Toy Rankings. In 2011 our “J.Edgar” (GrCh. Puggleswort Effbee Eye), who retired in 2008 after an outstanding career, returned to the show ring and achieved the coveted Supreme Championship title.

We now have three youngsters in the ring and two boys have won multiple In Group and In Show awards, the fawn boy winning Best In Group under an international judge at 8 months of age.

Without doubt my greatest achievement in Pugs has been the formation and the coordination of the international working group which successfully stopped the recognition of brindle "pug like dogs" in Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Ireland, and the UK.

I have a 25 year involvement with the Canberra Toy Dog Club. I am currently Vice President, a position that I have held for over 18 years. In 2010 I was awarded life membership of the club. I have been involved in an executive committee role with the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club of Canberra since 2000. I am currently Vice President and Show Secretary/Manager, and in the past I held the position for a number of years as Secretary. I am also a regular contributor to Pug Talk magazine.

I was granted my Toy licence in 1992, Terriers in 1995, Utility in 1997 and Working Dogs in 2000. I have judged in several Australian states as well as New Zealand, USA, South Africa and Norway. I am very excited to now be judging in Canada!. (Mrs. Prideaux is also judging the Pug Club of Canada National Specialty as this show and prior to this NACA assignment "Fliss" and her husband will be visiting Ontario where she is judging for the Ottawa Kennel Club.)

NORMA SCHAFFER – my life with dogs began early with my father's hunting dogs, a pair of English Springer Spaniels. Recognizing my interest, a family friend introduced me to the Vancouver Junior Kennel Club where I became involved with obedience training. Education and work took priority for a few years, but when the time was right I acquired a puppy, became involved with obedience training once again and have had one or more Springer Spaniels in my household ever since. I have trialed my own dogs since 1975 and became an obedience judge in 1988. I am actively involved in tracking, obedience, rally, spaniel hunt tests, and the St. John Ambulance therapy dog program.

Presently I share my home with yet another Springer with whom I am enjoying all of these activities and have even ventured into the Conformation ring for the first time! I hope that each competitor who enters my ring has a good experience with their dog, regardless of the score they achieve.

DAVID SWARTWOOD – I have been raised with and training dogs for my entire life, my childhood dogs were Boston Terriers. My start in breeding pure-bred dogs began in high school with American Cocker, then followed by Lhasa Apsos and finally deciding on English Springer Spaniels as my breed of choice over 30 years ago. Bryden English Springer Spaniels have achieved international fame in Conformation, Obedience, Agility, Rally, Tracking, Therapy and even hunt tests, but mostly as beloved family pets.

When I moved to Canada in 1993 I changed the kennel name to Bryden and worked from then on with partner Thomas Nesbitt. Still breeding conservatively, we have enjoyed top Springer and top ten ranked Sporting Dog on many occasions and won the English Springer Spaniel Club of Canada Nationals four times. We also added Miniature Wire Haired Dachshunds under Thom's "Prelude" prefix and bred many Best in Show and Best in Specialty Dachshunds and have exported breeding stock around the world.

As an all-breed handler for more than 20 years, handling more than 100 different breeds, I have given that up to devote time to judging. I am currently licensed to judge Hounds, Sporting, Toys and Terriers. At the International All Breed Canine Shows (sanctioned by UCI) I judged all breeds and provided written critiques for every exhibit. I have had the honour of judging across Canada and the US, Mexico, New Zealand, Australia, Indonesia, Chile and Colombia.

I have been lucky to work with all aspects of dogs from veterinary technician, handler, conformation, obedience and agility instructor, groomer and behaviourist, and this wide cross section of dogs gives me a balance in my judging and the opportunity to enjoy the sport of dogs from every angle.

In our spare time we run a small farm with sheep, goats, donkeys, llamas, and a wide variety of poultry, turkeys, chickens, guinea hens, quail and peacocks among them; all of which are trained like my dogs!

I love every moment of judging and meeting new people with the similar interest of preserving the sport of pure bred dogs.

JANE TREIBER – my husband and I acquired our first Dane in 1972. He was a harlequin, and was sold to us as "show quality." Well, you can probably guess the punch line. He was not show quality, but he was a wonderful companion and went everywhere with us: camping, sledding, hiking, swimming, etc. Meanwhile, we went to some matches, dog shows and handling classes. and studied the Standard and every book we could find about Danes and handling. There were not many publications at that time, but we found the dog that we wanted to be behind our foundation in New Hampshire. His name was Ch. Dinro's Simon Templar, bred by Rose Roberts. Off we went in the motor home from California to New Hampshire. Long story short – we got a German import male and a dog and bitch sired by Simon, who was the top harlequin in the country. We also bought a Basset bitch from Simon's owner, who is to this day my best friend and mentor.

We bred Bassets and Great Danes for the next 20 years under the name “KIMO” which is a Mojave Indian word for Big Dog. We were very blessed to have the foundation stock that we had and the mentoring of my best friend. We have produced many generations of Champions, Specialty winners, group placing and group winning dogs in both breeds.

I applied to judge Bassets first as I was specializing a Great Dane. When his career was finished I applied for Danes. I am now approved to judge the Working group, the Hound group, Juniors and BIS. I enjoy judging, and I try to make every exhibitor comfortable in my ring and feeling as if their exhibit was judged fairly. I have judged Specialties for many breeds all over the country and in Canada. I have judged the Canadian National, and several years ago I judged the Dane Specialty in New Zealand. I also judged a Dane, Basset and Rhodesian Ridgeback Specialty in Australia. I was on the Board of the Great Dane Club of America for six years, and I am the Judges' Education Chairman for the Parent club. I have just completed the production of an educational CD on the Great Dane for judges, breeders, exhibitors, and anyone who wishes to learn about the “Apollo of Dogs”.

CONFORMATION

The following CKC conformation classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

Baby Puppy (3-6 Mths): offered Friday only. For dogs 3 mths of age & under 6 mths of age

Junior Puppy: for dogs 6 mths of age but under 9 mths of age.

Senior Puppy: for dogs 9 mths of age but under 12 mths of age

12-18 Months: for dogs 12 mths of age and under 18 mths of age

Canadian Bred: for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded.

Bred by Exhibitor: for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

Open: for all dogs.

Specials Only: dogs which are registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club and have attained championship status may be entered in the "Specials Only" class. **Exhibition Only:** for all dogs over 6 mths of age and eligible for registration with the CKC (non-competitive class).

Veterans: offered Saturday only. Veterans will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Veteran in Group and Best Veteran in Show. Dogs must be 7 years or older on the day of the show.

Altered: offered Sunday only. Altered will be divided Males and Females with a Best of Breed judged for each. The Best of Breed winner will go on to Best Altered in Group and Best Altered in Show. All dogs must be surgically altered to enter this show.

OBEDIENCE

Pre-Novice: for any pure bred dog that has not earned the title PCD (Pre Companion Dog) title in

Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A dog may be entered in this class that has not earned the title of CD in Canada or US.

Novice A: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for this class.

Novice B: for any purebred dog that has not won the title of CD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. More than one dog may be entered by any handler, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'sit' and 'down' exercise. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class.

Novice C: for any purebred dog that has gained a CD, CDX, UD or any other advanced title and exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice classes. Scores earned in Novice C are not eligible for High in Trial. This is an elective class and offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience. Dogs may be entered in Novice C class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial classes.

Open A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD but has not won the title of CDX. Only one dog may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is not eligible for entry in this class.

Open B: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CD, CDX or UD in CANADA. Dogs in this class may be handled by any person. A dog which has won a comparable degree in any foreign country is eligible for this class. A dog may be entered in both Open A and Open B at any one trial. A dog eligible for UD is also eligible for entry in this class at the same trial.

Utility A: for any purebred dog that has won the title of CDX in CANADA. Handlers may enter more than one dog in this class, but each dog must have a separate handler for the 'group examination' exercise.

Utility B: for any purebred dog and handler where the dog has achieved a CDEX and a UD title and for dogs and handlers where the handler has put a MOTCH title on any dog.

RALLY

Rally Novice A: Dogs entered in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Novice B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. No dog may be entered in Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Rally Advanced A: For dogs that have won the Rally Novice title but have not won the Rally Advanced title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Advanced B: for dogs that have won the Rally Novice title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Rally Excellent A: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title but have not won the Rally Excellent title or any CKC Novice Obedience title.

Rally Excellent B: for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced title. No dog may be entered in the Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B class at the same show.
