#### DAVID GILMOUR, Saskatchewan

Late in 1987, my wife and I welcomed a male Boxer puppy into our home. The following year, we joined the Canadian Kennel Club and I put a championship on our puppy. So began my involvement in the world of purebred dogs.

Since then, I have: taught socialization and obedience puppy classes; participated in obedience trials and conformation shows; taken tracking lessons; joined the Boxer Club of Canada (life member and current President); joined the American Boxer Club (life member in 2021); mentored aspiring judges at ABC National Specialties; joined the Prairie Canine Academy (current vice president); performed Show Superintendent duties for the Prairie Canine Academy; and performed duties as ring steward for various clubs in Western Canada and Ontario.




I am a life member of the Canadian Kennel Club and I

recently completed my third 3-year term as the Saskatchewan Director for the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club.

My wife and I have been breeding Boxers under the Zaracon prefix since 1991. With limited breeding we have produced 20 Canadian champions of which 2 were also American champions. We have had 2 Dams of Merit, the Top Boxer Puppy for 2007 (a shared honour), the Dam of the Year for 2007, and were named the Breeder of the Year for 2007, all Boxer Club of Canada awards. Our Boxers have participated in and obtained titles / certificates in obedience; agility; herding; lure coursing; and conformation in Canada and the States, including wins / awards at national and regional specialties.

I am undergoing the process for dog show judging in Canada. I am licensed for Groups 1 to 6 and I am on permit for Group 7.

I have judged specialties for Miniature Schnauzers, Siberian Huskies, Australian Shepherds, and Dobermans. I have also judged specialties for Boxers across Canada and the United States. In April 2019, I had the honour of judging the Boxer Club of New South Wales Specialty in Sydney, Australia, as well as breed specialties for American Cocker Spaniels, Gordon Setters, and Vizslas.



#### GARTH GOURLAY, Ontario

I started attending dog shows in the early 70s well before having a pure-bred dog. It wasn't until 1974 that I got my 1st English setter from breeder mentor Sally Vertulia (Wragge Run kennels). Sally taught me structure, form and function and hardly ever mentioned a dogs show record, rather concentrating on how that animal contributed to breeding line.

Rocket forwards a few years, my wife Karen and I have been breeding English setters Vizslas and Australian shepherds under the "Wyldewood" prefix. We have been active in and have titled dogs both show and field. Today we just have a few setters, some sheep and almost 8 grand kids!

In 1999 I was licensed to judge the sporting group. Sporting dogs have always been my comfort zone and is my only group that I am licensed.

I have had the honor of judging breed, groups, Specialties and Nationals and field events in both Canada and the USA.



#### PENNY LEWIS, Saskatchewan

#### Breeder owner handler of Bretica Whippets

Penny started handling dogs in 1976 as a fouryear-old Pee Wee, Junior Handler helping her mother Donna Lewis to breed, raise and train dogs of Donayne Perm Reg'd ML Dachshunds, Keeshonden and Shetland Sheepdogs. family summer vacations were loading up the family and dogs and hitting the road with the camper to camp at all the dog shows throughout Western and Eastern Canada. When Penny was old enough to take the city bus by herself, she would load up her Miniature Longhaired Dachshund, Sera, in her adidas bag with Sera's head sticking out of the

bag and jump on the city bus every Saturday morning to Junior Handling Classes at the Regina Kennel and Obedience Club. Penny enjoyed her Junior Handling days so much that at the age of 16 started instructing Junior Handling and Adult Handling classes at the Regina Kennel and Obedience Club. At the age of 17 Penny started handling for others. This led to a very successful career as An All-Breed Professional Handler and a member of Canadian Professional Handlers Association. Winning many Best in Shows/ Specialties and finishing many Canadian and American Champions with various breeds of dogs. This was Penny's fulltime life for 35 years travelling all over North America with her two Children Jessica and Brett when they could come along.

Penny became a Breeder on her own later in her life because of being so focused on being a Professional Handler and Educating herself on ALL BREEDS there was just no time for being a breeder until that day she was hired to show a whippet and fell in love with the breed.

Penny has owned and shown Whippets, Dobermans, Pomeranians, Manchester Terrier, English Setter, Miniature Long Haired Dachshunds, Pointer, Alaskan Malamute and Rottweilers. As an All-Breed Handler Penny was very successful with all breeds and enjoyed every win like it was her first.

Instructor of Penny's Conformation Bootcamps for many years and enjoys every minute of teaching people to show their own dogs to this day. Always wanting to help anyone in this sport.

Penny's focus on her career since starting to show dogs was always to have fun and do this with great sportsmanship. Most people would say if you wanted to find Penny at a show just listen for her laugh.

In 2019 at age 47 Penny Pursued her next goal to become a Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) Judge and retired as an All-Breed Professional Handler as of Jan 14th, 2020. 43 years of great memories, learning and teaching was now a Full circle of everything a person could do in this sport of Purebred dogs. In 2022 Penny became a 30 plus year member in Good Standing with the Canadian Kennel Club.

Since becoming a Canadian Kennel Club Judge Penny has been very fortunate to judge all over Canada. Her most memorable assignment so far was judging the Stampede Whippet Specialty in Calgary Alberta in 2022 with an entry of over 50 whippets. This assignment was very special to her because she was voted in to judge by her peers in the Canadian whippet community also because Penny along with her Bretica whippets had won this same specialty a few times in the prior years.

When not at dog show Judging or exhibiting her own dogs, you will find Penny enjoying the 4x4

mud truck and ATV life. Penny also continues with her Bretica whippets and enjoys her family as much as possible and yard work when at home on her 10 acres. She Also finds time to work from home as a Legal assistant, Saskatchewan marriage, Oaths commissionaire and a full time Volunteer Firewoman within her community.

#### STEFAN MITREVSKI, Macedonia

became involved in showing and breeding dogs from 2005 starting a successful exhibitor career, helping with the organization of Macedonian dog shows, and in 2007 registered his Siberian Husky Kennel "Inner Vision". That way he began the "Inner Vision" breeding program and since that time has won many national and international shows where he had great success due to the outstanding producing ability of his foundation sires and dams. He participated as an exhibitor at the European and World Dog Shows as well, with great results. In 2015 dogs from our breeding become: "Silverado of Inner Vision"- Junior World Winner and "Tristan of Inner Vision" - Vice Junior European Winner "Tristan Of Inner Vision". In 2016 we got one more Vice Junior European Winner - Inner Vision Viva El Paso. In 2021 Ch. Inner Vision Fabian become Vice World Winner as well.



Born in Skopje, the capital city of Macedonia, Stefan loved animals from an early age, especially dogs and cats that grew up by his side. This special kind of love and affection towards dogs started with the hunting dogs and Irish Setter that he owned as young. Together with his family later in 1994 owned few German Shepherds, but later on as his taste developed, he become devoted to the Siberian Husky Breed. He has been fortunate to breed many dogs that became National and International Champions, Best in Show winners. He has also exported many show dogs across the USA, Europe and Asia in respectful and established kennels.

He was President and one of the founders of the Kennel Club for Polar Breeds in Macedonia and now he is President of All breeds Kennel Club "Polaris", he was involved in organizing many specialty shows in the past years and working towards continuing this great tradition in promoting the Macedonian sinology. From 2018 till 2020 he was member of Presidium of Kennel Association of Macedonia, FCI judge from 2011 and was member of judges' examination commission and has offered his expertise on national and international shows as well as on specialty shows around the world. He has been judging in: Macedonia, Serbia, Bulgaria, Kosovo,

Montenegro, Ukraine, Belarus, Russia, Italy, Bosnia & Hercegovina, Sweden, Croatia, Greece, Israel, Poland, Lithuania, Moldova, France, Czech Republic Iceland, Belgium, Australia, Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia, Vietnam, China and Brazil!

#### YOGESH TUTEJA, India

Mr.Yogesh Tuteja a pharmacist by profession is a keen dog lover since childhood who has always kept dogs. His passion for pure bred dogs started in the year 1990 when he got his first GSD and starting showing him and then there was no looking back. His kennel by the name of "VAATTOO's" is well known in India and abroad. Mr. Yogesh Tuteja has kept and bred GSD's, Dobermans, Boxers, Rottweiler's, Great Danes, Bullmastiffs, Labradors, Pomeranians, Pugs, Pekingese, Miniature Pinschers, Dachshunds, Beagles, Fox terriers, Poodles and Lhasa Apso's making champions in most of the breeds. and Rottweiler's and is popular as a TOY MAN of India.

Mr. Tuteja was the first one to import Rottweiler's in north India and campaigned them extensively all over India. Currently he is concentrating on Pugs, Beagles, Boxers and Doberman's His home bred dogs have gone on to win various board placements at many occasions including a Best in show line up, Best bred in India and Best puppy also.

Mr.Yogesh Tuteja is a founder secretary of the Amritsar kennel club, life member of The Kennel club of India, Founder member and executive committee member in Pug Dog Club of India, member German shepherd dog club of India and a licensed ring steward. He is perhaps the only ring steward from India to have taken up an international stewarding assignment at an FCI show held at Lahore (Pakistan).

#### SATURDAY, APRIL 13

#### Held under CKC Rules. Judge to be announced the day of the show.

#### **Class Structure (Age Requirements)**

#### 1. PEE WEE

For handlers 4 years of age up to 6 years of age. Optional and noncompetitive. No placements are to be awarded, participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

#### 2A. JUNIOR NOVICE

For handlers 7 to 10 years who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

#### 2B. JUNIOR OPEN

For handlers 7 to 10 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Junior Novice Class, OR any handler wishing to enter this level. It is understood that once that handler has entered and competed in the Open Class, he/she may not compete in the Novice Class again.

#### 3A. INTERMEDIATE NOVICE CLASS

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

#### **3B. INTERMEDIATE OPEN CLASS**

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have won six first places in the same class with competition.

#### 4A. SENIOR NOVICE CLASS

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition. Handlers from the Intermediate levels progress to this class.

#### 4B. SENIOR OPEN CLASS

For handlers 15 years of age and up to 18 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he/she has enough experience to compete at this level.

#### 5. BEST OVERALL

## **HEALTH REMINDERS**

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.



**ZERO TOLERANCE** – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Ontario Breeders Association Events will be asked to leave the Event grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit.

**Definition of Bullying:** Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.

#### Examples include:

- insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits
- spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo
- berating/belittling an individual
- unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- giving insulting Nicolaasnames
- engaging in practical jokes that humiliate
- undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work
- physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates
- mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms
- yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles
