CONFORMATION:



Since 1977, Bo Skalin has owned the Giant Schnauzers and since 1984 also the Miniature Schnauzers. On the beginning he was mainly interested and involved in the working trials and shows, but in 1985 the first litter was born under prefix Hassan Hill's and during 20 years there were bred over 50 Champions Giant and Miniature Schnauzers, gained over 100 titles around the world. For the successful breeding the kennel was awarded by the special plaque from the Swedish Schnauzer-Pinscher Club and by the Hamilton plaque from the Swedish Kennel Club (SKK). 

Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the action.
- 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

BORDER CROSSING

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada. Government regulations require this Certificate and MUST be dated at least 30 days prior to re-entry into the US.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 15 MONTHS - This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 15 months of age on the day of the show

15 to 18 MONTHS - This class shall be for any dog 15 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN - This class shall be for all dogs

VETERANS CLASS - This class shall be for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Class divided by age: 7 years up to 10 years, 10 years up to 12 years and 12 years and older. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. The winner of each class in each sex will compete for Best of Breed.

FIELD DOG CLASS - This class shall be for any dog with a title or placement in a field trial or test, divided by sex. Spayed and Neutered dogs may compete. Judged prior to Best of Breed judging and the winners in each sex will compete for Best of Breed.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. TCN Fees WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

Dogs entered in the Non-regular classes must also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only except for Stud Dog and Brood Bitch whose progeny MUST be entered in a regular class.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

BABY PUPPY - This class is for dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show

STUD DOG/BROOD BITCH - This class is for a stud dog/brood bitch and two or more of his/her get.

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

GUN DOG - This unofficial class is for all Retrievers who have earned a Certificate of Merit or better at a Licensed Field Trial, or who have received a Junior Hunter Title or higher, a Working Certificate or higher, in Canada or the United States by the close of entries. Each dog must also be entered in a Regular class or for Exhibition only.

GENERATIONS - This is open to 3 or more generations families with one exhibit from each generation, exhibited from oldest to youngest of either sex. Spayed/neutered CKC/AKC registered dogs are eligible and ownership need not be identical. A separate entry form must be submitted for each dog entered, but only one entry fee for each generations family. Dogs entered in Generations must also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Eligibility for the Altered classes shall be limited to dogs over six months of age, which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered class judging. This class WILL be judged upon the completion of Best of Breed. Two classes ONLY will be offered:

ALTERED MALE AND ALTERED FEMALE

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each sex will be declared Winners and the second place winner from each sex will be awarded Reserve. The Altered Winners Male and Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best Altered in Breed.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES

Ring Size Approximately 40' x 60'

No dog may be entered in both Novice "A" and Novice "B", Open "A" and Open "B" at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

NOVICE C - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a CD or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN HA - The Open HA class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a UD title may not handle a dog in this class.

Open18A -The requirements are the same as Open HA and the same rules except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

OPEN HB - The Open HB class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

Open 18B - The requirements are the same as Open HB and the same rules except the addition of the new Change of Positions Exercises and Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

UTILITY A - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

BRACE CLASS - This is open to any 2 dogs that earned the title of CD or higher. The 2 dogs need not be owned by the same person but must be the same breed for a breed specialty obedience trial. The owner or any other person may handle a brace and they may enter more than one. The same handler must handle each brace in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more braces entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra brace when they are judged together in the group exercises. The Brace Class is performed and judged in the same manner as the Novice Class. The 2 dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance of the 2 dogs as though they were one.

TEAM CLASS - This is open to any 4 dogs that earned the title of CD or higher. The 4 dogs need not be owned by the same person but must be the same breed for a breed specialty obedience trial.

VETERANS CLASS - For any dog that has earned a title of CD or higher and is 7 years old or older on the day of the trial. The exercises shall be performed and judged as in the Novice Class. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

RALLY CLASSES

Ring Size Approximately 40' x 60'

No dog may be entered in both Advanced "A" and Advanced "B" at the same trial or Excellent "A" and Excellent "B" at the same trial.

RALLY NOVICE A - Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the RN title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title or CKC RA title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one (1) trial.

RALLY NOVICE B - Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

RALLY ADVANCED A - This class shall be for dogs that have earned the RN title but have not earned the RA title or any CKC obedience title other than PCD. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX title or CKC RE title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one (1) trial.

RALLY ADVANCED B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (RN) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT A - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (RE) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Companion Dog Excellent (CDX) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this case must be the owner, the co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class, A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class .However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B - This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (RA) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (RE) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class, A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honor Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY MASTER - This class is for dogs that have earned the RE title. Any person may handle the dog in this class. Dogs must earn 3 qualifying scores of 85 points or more under at least 2 different judges.

BRACE CLASS - This is open to any 2 dogs that earned the title of RN or higher. The 2 dogs need not be owned by the same person but must be the same breed for a breed specialty obedience trial. The owner or any other person may handle a brace and they may enter more than one. The same handler must handle each brace in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more braces entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra brace when they are judged together in the group exercises. The Brace Class is performed and judged in the same manner as the Novice Class. The 2 dogs shall be hitched together with a brace chain or coupling and are judged on the performance of the 2 dogs as though they were one.

TEAM CLASS - This is open to any 4 dogs that earned the title of RN or higher. The 4 dogs need not be owned by the same person but must be the same breed for a breed specialty obedience trial.

JUVENILE SWEEPSTAKES - FRIDAY, JULY 19th, 2024

Juvenile Sweepstakes is for all puppies six months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following six classes (divided by sex):

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Veteran Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 50% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes

Best of Opposite in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes

25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

BREEDER SWEEPSTAKES - FRIDAY, JULY 19TH, 2024 FOLLOWING VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Breeder Sweepstakes is open to all dogs entered in a regular class or for exhibition only in the regular show. Dogs must be handled by its breeder but does not have to be owned by its breeder. Dogs may not be spayed or neutered. Class will be divided male/female.

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Breeder Sweepstakes.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC DAYLIGHT TIME.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms and must be on leash at all times on the show grounds or within the show building with the exception of the obedience rings.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or venders/concessions.

The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show.

No liquid waste is to be disposed of in garbage cans.

No catering of any kind is permitted.

The club reserves the right of restricting exhibitors grooming space.

Any videographer or photographer, other than the official videographer/photographer, that is going to take pictures and or videos for which they will be paid, will require written permission from the Pacific Kennel Club Show Committee and the official show videographer/photographer.

FIRE SAFETY RULES:

All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- 15.2.4 **Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)** The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a
- (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, ho minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 **Grand Champion Silver (GChS)** The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 **Grand Champion Gold: (GChG)** The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Pacific Kennel Club and the NSDT Retriever Club of Canada, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
