JUDGES AND ASSIGNMENTS



Conformation: Vandra Huber Woodinville, WA

Dr. Vandra L. Huber has been involved in the sport of purebred dogs for more than 30 years. Under the Kennel name of McVan®, she and her husband Michael Krolewski have bred more than 125 American champions and 50 Canadian champions. Her Scottish Terriers have garnered national specialty honors in the USA and Canada, In 2012 and 2013, her Scotties have gotten BOB at Crufts and at the USA National Specialty GCH Am. Can. Intl. Ch. McVan's Be Bop Baby "Betsy" and her sister GCH Am. Russ. Ch. McVan's To Russia with Love "Knopa" respectively. Knopa finished 2013 as the No. 1 Scottish Terrier in the U.S. Dr. Huber also was the co-owner of Ch. Gaelforce Postscript "Peggy Sue" who went Best in

Show at the Westminster Kennel Club in the mid 1990s.

Dr. Huber also has owned and bred several other terrier breeds: Smooth and Wire FoxTerriers, Border Terriers, Cairn Terrier, Miniature Schnauzer, as well as an Affenpincher, Bearded Collie, Wire-Haired Dachshunds and a Miniature Poodle. She has judged Scottish Terrier national specialties in Japan, Germany and the United States. Internationally, she also has judged in Australia, Sweden (World Terrier Show), Thailand, Finland, Latvia and Russia. Vandra is passionate about the sport of purebred dogs and enjoys traveling internationally to judge.

In her professional life, Vandra L. Huber is a professor of Human Resources and Management at the Foster Business School at the University of Washington, Seattle, WA. She is the author of several textbooks and more than 50 academic articles. Her consulting engagements have included Nokia Corporation, Boeing, Microsoft and Schakra and served as an expert witness. Dr. Huber was a Fulbright Scholar in Thailand. In 2014 she was a Visiting Professor at Korea University. Dr. Huber coordinates the Certificate in Business Administration (CBA) graduate program. As Faculty Director of Global Studies for the Foster Business School, she led student study groups to India, South Africa, and Peru. Dr. Huber has a B.S. and M.S. in journalism and labor economic respectively from the University of Utah. She received a Masters in Business Administration (MBA) and a Doctorate (DBA) from Indiana University.

Sweepstakes: Mr. Barry Truax



Barry Truax and his partner Guenther Krueger breed Scottish Terriers under the Glenfraser prefix. They have bred 37 Canadian and 10 American Champions, with 8 of their dogs placing nationally in the Top 5 since 1986. Junior Handling: Ms. Barb Turpin



Barbara Turpin is a third generation dog breeder. Under the kennel name "Of Course",• her family's Whippets are known for being true dual purpose dogs. They have excelled in both racing and showing for more than 50 years.

Ms. Turpin has had Rhodesian Ridgebacks since 1995 and still holds fast to the family legacy of breeding dogs that are well able to perform the function for which they were bred. She was a panelist at the 2004 World Congress on the subject of Breed Specific Legislation, started the Rhodesian Ridgeback Club of Canada, has written numerous breed-related articles, is a past rescue coordinator and is a "Dogs in Canada"• photography contest winner. She is also a novice judge, handling coach, doggy doula and self-taught canine herbalist. She

has recently been invited to speak at the 2016 World Congress in Denmark. Of Course Rhodesian Ridgebacks are known internationally as dynamic movers, dedicated performance dogs, excellent producers, and consistent winners in local shows as well as breed specialties. Of Course get is seen world wide succeeding in the show ring, on the coursing field, in obedience competitions, working as therapy dogs, doing scent work and even in Iron Dog competitions. Refusing fads, Ms. Turpin's dogs are typically true wheaten, standard size and nearly always naughty.

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank you.

BORDER CROSSING

A Rabies Certificate is required to bring a dog into Canada.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS- This class shall be for any dog 12 months but under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada. (Champions of any country excluded)

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN CLASS - This class shall be for all dogs

VETERANS CLASS - This class is for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. The winners of the veteran male and veteran female classes DO NOT compete for championship points but go directly on to the Best of Breed competition.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A TCN dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR to the breed judging. TCN fees WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

BABY PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male, Best Baby Female, Best Baby Puppy in Breed, Best Baby Puppy in Group

BRACE - This class is for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily the same sex). A brace must be handled by one person on one lead.

STUD DOG & GET - This class shall be comprised of the stud dog and 2 or more of his get. Ownership need not be identical. The stud dog may be neutered and must be entered in a Regular class or in Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular Class.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY - same requirements as the Stud Dog & Get. The brood bitch may be spayed.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

BREEDER/OWNER/HANDLER - This class is for breeder/owner/handler. The owner MUST enter this class, either online at Dogshow.ca or check the box provided on the entry form, to be eligible. The dog must be handled by the owner for all levels of competition to be eligible for BOH in Breed and BOH in Group.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Eligibility for the Altered classes shall be limited to dogs over six months of age, which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered class judging. This class WILL be judged upon the completion of Best of Breed. Two classes ONLY will be offered:

Altered Male and Altered Female

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each sex will be declared Winners and the second place winner from each sex will be awarded Reserve. The Altered Winners Male and Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best Altered in Breed.

SWEEPSTAKES - Friday, April 19th, 2024 PRECEEDING CONFORMATION

Juvenile Sweepstakes

Judge: Mr. Barry Truax

Juvenile Sweepstakes is open to all Terriers in Group 4 puppies six months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes at this Specialty. Dogs will be judged in one of the following six classes (divided by sex):

Junior Puppy - 6 months and under 9 months Senior Puppy - 9 months and under 12 months Juvenile Puppy - 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 25% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes
Best of Opposite - rosette & 10% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes
1st in each class - rosette & 40% of class fees
2nd thru 4th in each class - flat ribbon
25% of total fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

JUNIOR HANDLING - Friday, April 19th, 2024 Following Conformation

Judge: Ms. Barb Turpin

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk up to one hour prior with no exceptions. \$2.00 entry fee.

The following classes will be provided:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years Junior Open - 7 to 10 years Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

Note: Pee Wees do not compete for best overall.

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only at this group specialty. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior but is for Terrier Breeds entered in this Specialty only.

Pee Wees - prize and flat ribbon

Best Overall Handler - rosette and prize

1st to 4th in each class - rosettes

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at: www.ckc.ca

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are PACIFIC TIME.
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

HERITAGE PARK FIRE SAFETY RULES:

Extension cord may not be stretched across fire lanes.

Tape of any kind is not to be used on the floors.

All power cords must be unplugged at night.

Power bars are not permitted as they will blow fuses.

Aisles must be kept open at all times to allow everyone easy and speedy exit in case of emergency. All designated FIRE LANES must be kept clear at all times or vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Crates will be allowed at ringside during the judging of your specific breed only and must be removed immediately after. No Exceptions.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or venders/concessions. The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content.

I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Renaissance and BC All Terrier Club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes. I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.


In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

- 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.
- 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.
- (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- 15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)
- 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.
- 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:
- (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)
- (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.
- (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.
- 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.
- 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.
- 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022
