I am an Irish Wolfhound addict. Their intelligence, their strength as well as their companionship, loyalty and devotion have me hopelessly hooked. I can't really imagine ever being without one - preferably two. They are magnificent creatures capable of running down and killing prey or laying on the floor to be a baby jungle gym if is what makes their family happy.

We currently live with 12 hounds ranging in age from 8.5 years down to 3 weeks. We bought our first wolfhound from Sam Ewing (Eagle) some 22 years ago. It was a unique education to be able to stand in a paddock full of teenage wolfhounds or puppies, racing around while Sam quizzed you on what you liked about that one. I was also fortunate enough to be mentored by Jacky Karpinski (Karn Irish Wolfhounds). She was an amazing friend to us and an amazing ambassador for the breed. Jacky was always on the lookout for the extraordinary hound, regardless of who bred it. She also taught me the value of the "useful" hound. That hound that was not necessarily the big winner or the one that takes your breath away but that hound that could contribute what was needed for your next generation.

Through the generosity of other long time breeders and mixture of luck, perseverance and hard work, we have been honored to live with, breed and coown some extraordinary hounds. All were owner handled and shown sparingly. Over the years our hounds have won Specialties, won the breed at Westminster, won the breed at the Eukanuba Invitational, have been top 5 coursing hounds, therapy dogs, and one special hound that appeared in the Nutcracker ballet in Lockport, NY for several seasons. All of them have been cherished friends and family members.

Over the years we have strived to produce athletic, hunting hounds that could still hunt and protect the family, if need be. Chasing the ever elusive, perfect, rough-coated greyhound-like hound, that is fit and fast enough to catch the wolf. That hound that is athletic and strong enough in mind and body to kill its prey and survive the encounter with little injury to itself.

Thank you all for inviting me to go over your babies and adults.

What a privilege and opportunity for me to be able to go over your youngsters.

I have owned Irish Wolfhounds since 1970 when I purchased my first hound 'Buckhurst Theresa' when I was 16. She was still by my side 11½ years later. My father took pity on me and gave the final twenty guineas to buy her, as despite saving all I could for three years and working in a kennels and a grooming parlour in school holidays I was still unable to reach the £63 cost on my own! The young man who worked for my father at that time while he waited to go to University knew something about dog shows, which introduced me to the concept. I later became Mrs Thornton, we co owned the "Mochras" affix.

Number of hounds? Between two and eight wolfhounds at any one time, three at the moment. I have always fitted wolfhounds around my working life, probably to the detriment of both "careers". There have been many occasions with the dogs when I had to pass up great opportunities because of lack of time for a new puppy or a litter, but this created some new friendships and sent a number of champions into the world through telling others where these prospects were.

Since becoming independent from my parents many years ago (their very convenient "retirement project" of boarding kennels with kennelmaids took a while to break away from) my family of hounds has always shared their life with me. There are always wolfhounds on the sofas and I ensure they aren't left alone for long as my partner Bruce Little loves the dogs as much as I do. Whenever lure coursing meeting are available we support them and we are fortunate to live on the edge of 7,000 acres of woodland full of interesting walks, the dogs do keep their "eye in" on deer and foxes which of course we don't hunt (its illegal in the UK these days).

Pretty well all of my hounds have enjoyed outings to dog shows and to have bred a champion in my first litter was extremely pleasing. I have supported health initiatives in the breed, for instance the heart testing scheme has had all my hounds within it since its inception over 25 years ago. I have tried to work with families which have the better emphasis on longevity (as long as it runs alongside steady character) and know just how hard it is to breed type, character and soundness as a "package". This breed is full of surprises and when an older breeder says "wolf-hounds aren't easy" you can believe them.

I started judging in the late 70s and have been grateful for the opportunity to see many wonderful wolfhounds at different stages of their careers and in many different countries. Many years ago one of my first overseas appointments was for Puget Sound IWC, it is my very great pleasure to return to this part of the world. I wonder if any descendants of the dogs I liked then will be around?

c) Junior Open Class

This class is for handlers 7 to 10 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year who have won 6 first places with competition.

d) Intermediate Novice Class

This class is for handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have not won 6 first places in the same class with competition.

e) Intermediate Open Class

This class is for handlers 11 to 14 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the competition year, who have won 6 first places with competition and for any handler who has progressed through the Junior Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.

f) Senior Novice Class

This class is for handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the com- petition year and up to 18 years of age, who have not won 6 first places with competition in this class. Handlers from the Intermediate lev- els progress to this class.

g) Senior Open Class
This class is for handlers 15 years of age as of December 31st of the year preceding the com- petition year and up to 18 years of age, who have won 6 first places with competition in the Senior Novice Class, and for any handler who has progressed through the Intermediate Open level and feels that he has enough experience to compete at this level.
