Mr Ken Meener (Reneem) is a British judge who has shown and bred Staffordshire Bull Terriers since 1988, securing 10 Crufts qualifiers and one Canadian Champion. He began judging in 1996 and has since judged over 600 Staffords, awarding Challenge Certificates in the UK and Australia. His CC and RCC winners have included Bellerophon Bevin Boy, Waystaff Strikes Back, Subaron Sharaan, Dinalghi Touch of Class, Hubbulls The Promise, Taraiel Trinity and in Australia, Castlebar Crown Jester, Bxact Ridin Dirty, Brohez Black Art and Dekabance She's the Bomb.

Mr. Meneer is judging in Germany this year and will be the Referee at UK's Southern Counties Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club, Downlands Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club and East Anglian Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club shows in 2018 and 2019.

This is Mr. Meneer's first judging engagement in Canada. He is looking forward to our Specialty and the Alberta Kennel Club Summer Classic.
