Judges' Biographies

DIANE ADORNO-LEGRAND

FCI All Breed International Judge

Judge licensed thru the FEDERACION CANINA DE VENEZUELA (FCV), but under the guidelines of the FCI for she resides in a country which is a non FCI member, therefore, judging approvals for the FCI points must be requested from the Federation Cynologique Internacionale (FCI).

I began to venture into the world of Dog Shows in 1976 invited by my friend Rafael de Santiago, President of the FCPR, also of the FCI.



For many years I handled Boxers, Whippets, Salukis,

Pekingese, Italian Greyhound, Great Danes and owned and handled Smooth and Longhair Dachshunds, and other breeds including Afghan Hounds, acquiring my first Afghan hound which was bred by the late Sunny Shay, at that moment I realized my deep love for sight hounds. At the end of 1979 I met my first Saluki, who also belonged to Sunny Shay and there my love for this wonderful breed, did not acquire my first Saluki until 1991 from well-known Coppercrest kennels.

In the year 1996, I received my first invitation to judge and have done so in many countries including Australia, Canada, Colombia, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, México and others. In 2009 was invited to Canada to judge the Saluki National and the Bouvier des Flandres National, in 2010 to Australia to judge the Sydney Sighthound Specialty, Rhodesian Ridgeback Regional and again in 2018 for the Saluki Club of South Wales, breeds at the 4P's club and finals of the Sighthound Association Specialty.

With my partner Maria Elsa Pérez T., we started Shaman Salukis in 1993 since then we have bred many Venezuelan, International and American champions also some acquired championships from several other countries. From these 2 litters we had 1 Multi BIS champion with 7 titles including World'97 champion, Top Sighthound in Venezuela in 1996 and 1997 and 1999 and then his son was the BIS at the "Purina Ranking 2002" Judged by an FCI All Breed Judge out of the 49 top Venezuelan Dogs of that year.

In 2000 acquired my first Standard Smooth Dachshund from the famous Rose Farm's kennel, he went to earn BIS in many countries. I then acquired my Standard Longhair Dachshund also Rose Farm bred 2 beautiful girls, "Salt" finished by 15 months from the bred by class and was No.1 LH Dachshund for AKC BBOH 2012, "Sugar" won many BOB and Grp placements too, they were 2 multiple breed winners.

Love my Salukis and Dachshunds.



DANIEL KWEE

FCI International All Breeds Judge No. 17741

Born in Bandung in year 1953. In year 1956 immigrated to Singapore, where I graduated my high school education, and move-on to California to complete my university education.

In year 1985, I return to Indonesia to continue the family business and I start to take an interest in conformation dog show as well as actively involved with The All-Indonesia Kennel Club (PERKIN) organization.

As a breeder I had experience in German Shepherd, Dobermann, Great Dane, Bull Terrier, Samoyed, Pomeranian, Petit Brussels Griffon, English Cocker Spaniel, American Cocker Spaniel, and Beagle.

During my years in conformation dog shows, I exhibited Great Danes under kennel prefix "VON APOLLO" and Pomeranian under kennel surfix "AMAZING GRACE". In both breeds achieved numbers of Indonesia Champions.

In early 90's, I start focusing in genetic, breeds standard, attending various breed conformation seminars in Indonesia, and special judge training conducted by Japan Kennel Club in Japan. In the same time fulfill the requirements set by PERKIN

Judges Commission to become a breed judge later to an all breeds judge.

In year 2007 I completed all FCI 10 groups examination and become one of the first three PERKIN (The All-Indonesia Kennel Club) All Breeds Judges in PERKIN. Since then, I have been judging FCI CAC, and CACIB All Breeds Show, Single Breed Specialty Show in all major cities in Indonesia as well as oversea countries such as Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Hong Kong, Japan, China, Vietnam, Cambodia, Japan, Taiwan, Philippines, Pakistan, India, Sri Lanka, New Zeeland, Australia, Canada, and USA.

I had held several positions in the PERKIN organization and breed club from the past until present.

When Penny was old enough to take the city bus by herself, she would load

up her Miniature Longhaired Dachshund, Sera, in her adidas bag with Sera's head sticking out of the bag and jump on the city bus every Saturday morning to Junior Handling Classes at the Regina Kennel and Obedience Club. Penny enjoyed her Junior Handling days so much that at the age of 16 started instructing Junior Handling and Adult Handling classes at the Regina Kennel and Obedience Club. At the age of 17 Penny started handling for others. This led to a very successful career as An All-Breed Professional Handler and a member of Canadian Professional Handlers Association. Winning many Best in Shows/ Specialties and finishing many Canadian and American Champions with various



breeds of dogs. This was Penny's fulltime life for 35 years travelling all over North America with her two Children Jessica and Brett when they could come along.

Penny became a Breeder on her own later in her life because of being so focused on being a Professional Handler and Educating herself on ALL BREEDS there was just no time for being a breeder until that day she was hired to show a whippet and fell in love with the breed.

Penny has owned and shown Whippets, Dobermans, Pomeranians, Manchester Terrier, English Setter, Miniature Long Haired Dachshunds, Pointer, Alaskan Malamute and Rottweilers. As an All-Breed Handler Penny was very successful with all breeds and enjoyed every win like it was her first.

Instructor of Penny's Conformation Bootcamps for many years and enjoys every minute of teaching people to show their own dogs to this day. Always wanting to help anyone in this sport.

Penny's focus on her career since starting to show dogs was always to have fun and do this with great sportsmanship. Most people would say if you wanted to find Penny at a show just listen for her laugh.

In 2019 at age 47 Penny Pursued her next goal to become a Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) Judge and retired as an All-Breed Professional Handler as of Jan 14th, 2020. 43 years of great memories, learning and teaching was now a Full circle of everything a person could do in this sport of Purebred dogs. In 2022 Penny became a 30 plus year member in Good Standing with the Canadian Kennel Club.

Since becoming a Canadian Kennel Club Judge Penny has been very fortunate to judge all over Canada. Her most memorable assignment so far was judging the Stampede Whippet Specialty in Calgary Alberta in 2022 with an entry of over 50 whippets. This assignment was very special to her because she was voted in to judge by her peers in the Canadian whippet community also because Penny along with her Bretica whippets had won this same specialty a few times in the prior years.

When not at dog show Judging or exhibiting her own dogs, you will find Penny enjoying the 4x4 mud truck and ATV life. Penny also continues with her Bretica whippets and enjoys her family as much as possible and yard work when at home on her 10 acres. She Also finds time to work from home as a Legal assistant, Saskatchewan marriage, Oaths commissionaire and a full time Volunteer Firewoman within her community.

JUDY MCVEIGH

Growing up in Edmonton, Alberta, my family always had and exhibited purebred dogs. My Uncle was fascinated with Scotties and when I showed an interest in the breed, he purchased me one of my own. After going to a dog show, I decided that this was something that I was interested in pursuing. I joined the Edmonton Junior Kennel Club and learned all about showing, not just what to do in the ring, this group was very active and put on several fun matches. I also learned that



despite an excellent pedigree, my dog didn't have what she needed to succeed in the show ring.

I began showing different breeds and helping professional handlers whenever possible. Over the years, I have been proud to have bred and exhibited Scotties under the MacIffen kennel name. Many of these dogs reached the top levels in the breed and were group and Best in Show winners. I continued to travel and show dogs while completing my education degree at the University of Alberta. I was fortunate to have a long and varied career with Sturgeon

School Division. I retired recently after 42 years with them.

Over the years, many other breeds were added to our household. My daughter bred and showed Miniature Wire-Haired Dachshunds. My son was very successful in and showing many Best in Show winning Wire Fox Terriers, a breed that continues to share my heart and my home even now. Both were very successful in their chosen breeds and in the Junior Handling rings.

In 1993, I decided to pursue my Judges' license. Unfortunately, the challenges of being a single parent necessitated putting this on hold while my children grew and chased their dreams.

Despite the restrictions that Covid put on our world, I achieved All-Breed status in 2020. I have had the privilege of judging dogs across Canada, the United States and Australia. I no longer breed or exhibit at but you never know what the future holds.

I am a life member of the Canadian Kennel Club. I am a long-standing board member of the Wire Fox Terrier Club of Canada, I am also an active member in the Canadian Scottish Terrier Club, the Canadian Dog Judges' Association and the Northern Alberta Canine Association.

Class Structure (Age Requirements)

1. PEE WEE

For handlers 4 years of age up to 6 years of age. Optional and non-competitive. No placements are to be awarded, participant ribbons, rosettes and token trophies may be presented.

2A. JUNIOR NOVICE

For handlers 7 to 10 years who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

2B. JUNIOR OPEN

For handlers 7 to 10 years of age, who have won six first places with competition in the Junior Novice Class, OR any handler wishing to enter this level. It is understood that once that handler has entered and competed in the Open Class, he/she may not compete in the Novice Class again.

3A. INTERMEDIATE NOVICE CLASS

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have not won six first places in the same class with competition.

3B. INTERMEDIATE OPEN CLASS

For handlers 11 to 14 years of age, who have won six first places in the same class with competition.

4A. SENIOR NOVICE CLASS

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
- 2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- 3. The Club and MJN Show Services will not be responsible of cash sent through the mail.
- 4. The Club reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.
- 5. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
- 6. Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, disqualified or barred from competition by action of the bench Committee.
- 7. Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials or unfinished Specials back to the classes is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

TCNs can be obtained through your CKC member portal or by contacting the CKC.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registration number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$64.00 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

Non-Member Participation Fee

Effective January 1, 2011:

- A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$170.00 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

Specialty Classes

(both sexes)

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED - A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR & UNOFFICIAL CLASSES:

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

STUD DOG & GET – Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. Stud Dog may be neutered. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY – Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny. Brood Bitch must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Progeny must be entered in a Regular class. Brood Bitch may be spayed. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BRACE – Two dogs shown by a single handler on one lead. Ownership in this class need not be identical. Dogs must be entered in an Official Class or Exhibition Only.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.

CH and Champion Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing* 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 or more Points allocated 0 1 2 3 4 5 *includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge <u>SHALL NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges, with at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GCH and Grand Champion Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GCHEX and Grand Champion Excellent Points

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

Altered Champion and Altered Points

Section 13.8.1 Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion [Alt] and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 4.7.1 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Moving Class Dog to Specials Only

Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Moving from Specials Back to the Classes

Section 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.

CORRECTING SHOW RESULTS – NEW FOR 2024

Section 9.9 The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than **90 DAYS** following the date(s) of the event(s).

HEALTH REMINDERS

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.



ZERO TOLERANCE – Any individual initiating bullying tactics at the Ontario Breeders Association Events will be asked to leave the Event grounds premises immediately and for the remainder of the event (no refunds). A report will be filed with CKC and the Disciplinary Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit.

Definition of Bullying: Refers to a range of behaviors in which targeted individuals are repeatedly, and over time, treated in a mean, insulting or abusive way. Bullying can be initiated deliberately or unconsciously. The affected person may feel upset, afraid, isolated, or humiliated. The bully sometimes acts alone and sometimes as part of a group of people.

Examples include:

- insulting a person's skills, looks, or habits
- spreading false or malicious rumors, gossip, or innuendo
- berating/belittling an individual
- unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- giving insulting Nicolaasnames
- engaging in practical jokes that humiliate
- undermining or deliberately impeding a person's work
- · physical gesturing that intimidates, offends, degrades, or humiliates
- mocking a person's accent, abilities or mannerisms
- yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces, or belittles
